Fr. Tomas's Weekly Reflection

In the Eucharist we are facing the real presence of God. And we must say that, if we analyze this reality, it can only be perceived as insane. The insanity of God's presence in Bread and Wine. And we dare to ask the question: what motivated God to remain with us in this form?

Wasn't it enough that God himself was born of a woman, that He was preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom to sinners, that He allowed himself to be killed by men? Wasn't it insane enough? No, it wasn't. The source and the summit of God's insanity is the Eucharist - His real, tangible, physical presence among us.

And the only thing that motivated God to do this, is His love for us. He didn't want us to remain alone. He wanted us to have an encounter with Him, the Living God. He wanted us to have access to Him. And He gave us His Body and said: "take and eat", and His Blood saying: "take and drink". He told us to take it all, without exception.

There is more to the human happiness than just meeting our biological needs. There is a wish for recognition from others, a desire to be treated fairly and humanely, a longing for a bit of kindness and heart. But, above all, there is also a hunger of the human spirit: longing for a treasure that cannot be destroyed, for an inexhaustible source. And the only, the indispensable, source that fully satisfies our human exigency is the Eucharist, God present among us.

The Church reminds us today about this insanity of God, about His presence, by celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This Christ, present among us in the Blessed Sacrament, we worship and confess today!

Saturday, June 29th Mass Plenary Indulgence:

Join us for Mass at 9am as we celebrate our Patron: St. Peter

A **plenary indulgence** is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit the parochial church: on the titular feast; (Feast of the Patron Saint)

To gain a plenary indulgence you must:

- Be baptized and in the state of grace, at least at the time the indulgenced work is done.
- Have "the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin." Otherwise, the indulgence becomes partial, not plenary.

And fulfill these three conditions:

- Sacramentally confess your sins
- Receive Holy Communion.
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. One Our Father and one Hail Mary fully satisfies this.
