Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Journey is the key word in our Christian life, a synthesis of all our life's actions. We cover shorter or longer distances to reach the desired goal. Jesus in today's Gospel also sets out for a Journey to Jerusalem. The three persons, whom He encounters, represent our own journeys towards God, and our attitudes on the way.

"I will follow you wherever you go!" - says the first, enthusiastic young man. Jesus, however, calms down his youthful enthusiasm, because this man does not realize what he is signing up for. Jesus reminds him that to be a disciple means to share His misery.

The second person, who in turn is called by Jesus to follow him, wants first to go and bury his father. He is referring to the Jewish law that obliged them to bury their parents and relatives. Jesus points to the Kingdom of God and its priority over earthly matters, no matter how important. Being a disciple requires obedient following of God's voice.

Third man presents a less important reason: a desire to say goodbye to his family. But also this time Jesus straightens him out, reminding him and us, that looking back slows down our progress on the Journey.

The question that needs to be asked is: what conditions are we to fulfill in order to become witnesses of the Kingdom of God, on the Journey that we are on? We need to give up our fears and open ourselves to the circumstances in which we live. Because God's Grace works in and through our circumstances. God puts us in a specific place, among the specific people with whom we are to walk towards salvation. We are to proclaim the Kingdom of God by following God's will, through an honest life, filled with truth and love, knowing that time passes and never returns.
