

# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In today's Gospel Jesus sends his disciples to the places He intended to go to. We hear the words of Christ: "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. So ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Usually, these words are addressed to the "official" witnesses: priests, religious brothers and sisters or lay catechists. It is worth noting, however, that Jesus addresses these words not to the strict group of the twelve apostles, but that He also designates another seventy-two disciples, whom these words are directed to.

The proclamation of the Good News is not reserved exclusively for the "chosen ones". Or to put it differently: the number of God's "chosen ones" is not limited only to those with ministerial responsibilities. Every disciple of Jesus is to give witness to Him, so that others may believe. It's not possible to know Jesus and not to speak about Him. It would be contradictory. Those baptized cannot live as if it did not affect their lives. One of the inherent qualities of Faith is the desire to share it with others. Once you've found the way, you want to help others find it too. The vocation of all the baptized can be described as giving the world an evangelical flavor, as transforming and sanctifying the world from within, as illuminating all the paths on which people walk, with the light of faith, hope and charity.

When we were baptized, we've received a candle lit from the Paschal Candle - the symbol of Jesus Christ and His Light. Its flame symbolizes the light of Faith. First, it's our parents and godparents who take care of that light; then it's up to us to go and set others on fire with the light of our Faith. Faith is strengthened when it is transmitted. In the sacrament of Confirmation, we have received the Holy Spirit's power to enable us to bear witness, to be witnesses. Let us, therefore, allow the Holy Spirit of God to lead us. Listening to Jesus' words that "the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few", let us ask ourselves what are we doing to be counted among those laborers.

We participate in the Mass, we listen to Jesus who speaks to us in his word, we receive Him In the Most Holy Eucharist. However, He wants us to reach out to every man, our relatives, friends and neighbors. He wants us to bring Him to them. Because the closeness of God is expressed first of all by the closeness of people.
