## *Fr. Tomas's Weekly Reflection*

Heaven is within reach, at your fingertips. Within reach of a hand towards someone no one else is reaching out to. Since loving your neighbor should be like loving yourself, every gesture made towards your neighbor is an opportunity given to you to love yourself. What can we really love ourselves for? For what we have done to others. The Samaritan, who was deeply moved at the sight of a wounded man, enriched himself with a new unique feeling: compassion. Perhaps he was an insensitive man, and the encounter with this half dead, bloody, unfortunate victim, have helped him tremendously.

And maybe, as he came close, he recognized himself in the wounded wanderer? Unfortunate, misunderstood, rejected, hurt. One might think that he just wasted his time, but it is certain that he has acquired a new skill: dressing wounds. How precious: to dress the wounds, not to inflict them! I am beginning to wonder who heals whom: Samaritan the wounded person, or the wounded person heals the Samaritan, from his insensitivity and indifference?

Reading that the Samaritan has poured an oil on the wounds, I wonder if he knew what he was doing, because I've heard about pouring alcohol to disinfect the wounds, but to add oil to it? I have not heard about this practice. I can only explain it with generosity. When people do not know how to help someone else, they help with what they have, and generosity is the power that moves them. The generosity is a priceless quality, and again, I think that also this time the Samaritan received more than the person he's helping. To receive a physical relief is a lot less than to learn how to be generous. When you try to be generous only once, you will experience the happiness it gives you. The taste of generosity is richer than wine or oil!

The Samaritan then placed the wounded man on his animal. The word "animal" here serves as a reminder, that while we share many physical features and attributes with the creatures St. Francis used to call his brothers and sisters, we're not merely a two-legged mammals, because we can actively and consciously decide to help another human being. Finally, when he brings the victim to an inn, it seems strange to me that the host would let the Samaritan in the Jewish house without any resistance, and even with a troublesome patient. There must have been a reason, and perhaps it was the mercy that emanated from this anonymous good man.

The Samaritan lost time, lost wine and oil, lost money, but gained something much more valuable, something that made him worthy of Eternal Life. He has experienced the transition from the state of possessing to the state of being, the transition that is only possible through love, and the transition which is the goal of Christianity here on Earth.
