Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Our daily lives are filled with various worries and anxieties. They are often caused by a difficult situation or anticipation of such a situation. It was no different in the home of Lazarus, Martha and Mary, where Jesus was often hosted. Observing the behavior of the sisters, Jesus admonishes Martha not because she serves but because this simple activity completely absorbs her and does not allow her to see matters more important.

What in our daily lives is the cause of our anxieties and an obstacle to a good management of our time?

It often happens that the way we conduct our behavior is shaped by the way we want people to perceive us. We take into account what neighbors will say, what the coworkers will think, etc. They often shape our perception of the world, and our anxiety lies in the fact that we are faced with a dilemma: how to look good in their eyes, that they would not think negatively about us. That is when we begin to focus on secondary things and perceive the world through the prism of gossip, slander or denigration of others.

Another obstacle in our way of life is habits. It is said that they are the "second nature" of man. The habit is a certain behaviors, without which - as we think - the day would be different, worse or perhaps even lost. For some, these are prosaic activities of everyday life, such as drinking coffee, watching a favorite series or going for a walk with a dog. For others it will be a constant search for "holes in the whole", immoderate interest or curiosity concerning the lives of others. Habits can cause us to lose the "freshness" of life and the ability to look each day at the reality in which we live in a new, different light. They break into the stereotypical statements: "I already know", "I know better", "I have my opinion on the subject" or "I will not change my mind".

There are people, and there are many of them, whose lives are concentrated around the various TV series. Favorite shows determine the rhythm of a family life. People want to function similarly, implementing the scenes they've seen on the TV screen into their everyday life. The problem is that, this way, they overlook the most important, often special, real moments in their lives: there is no time to meet your relatives, no conversation, no common meals, no witnessing your baby's first steps, hearing their first words, because your favorite show has just started. The dominant theme at the table, at work or on the street is the fate of the film characters, their lifestyle, their struggles, or perhaps the new achievements of technology, culinary art or even the ancient aliens. In those circumstances it's easy to unknowingly take over the "film lifestyle" and to imitate often senseless and artificial situations.

Jesus in today's Gospel indicates that our responsibility is to focus on the events currently happening around us, and not to dwell on the past or indulge in unreal dreams or "what ifs" or depend on someone else's opinion. Looking at the attitude of Martha and Mary, Jesus indicated that Mary, listening to his words, has chosen the better part, that is, she understood well what to do at a given moment of time.
