Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

"Lord, teach us to pray." Prayer. What is it? It's something we think about in the most difficult moments of our lives, when all other resources have failed. In those moments our hands, by themselves, come together, tears of pain, emotion, sadness, come to our eyes. But also tears of hope: I love and I know that love prevails, so I pray.

"Lord, teach us to pray." Prayer is a cry for love, for the most precious thing in human life. Sometimes it's only very short, like voice mail left on God's account, or even like a text messages sent to God. We often say: I do not have time, so it has to be short. Or: I do not feel like praying. But do I really have to wait until I feel the thirst, the need for prayer? And if this "feeling" does not appear, what then? Can I forget about Him in whose name I was baptized. Can I forget Him who is good and forgives sins? Can I forget about Him who gives me himself in the Eucharist?

"Lord, teach us to pray." In the 21st century, our lives are gaining momentum, the world around us is speeding up, we are constantly changing our place of residence, place of work. We are always in a hurry to catch up with what is less important, forgetting about the most important calling of man: To know God! To worship God! To love God! To serve God! In order to fulfill this calling, we must talk to Him.

"Lord, teach us to pray." What is the most important is also the most beautiful. Time spent in prayer - though from purely human perspective - unproductive, lost, turns out to be an invaluable and the most reliable investment on Earth. We invest in eternal life, and God is the guarantor of this investment. He never gets tired, and He is never wrong. He knows each of us by name and is constantly waiting to meet with us.

"Lord, teach us to pray." Lack of time, lack of reflection and sensitivity, a demanding attitude, because I deserve this or that. These are probably the most important obstacles in my conversation with God. These obstacles arise when God has no place in my life. A friend who is forgotten ceases to be a friend, becomes someone distant, ultimately lost. What to do then? We need to rethink our relationship with God. Theory is not enough, we have to pray and trust. As long as we trust, we will receive what we're asking for. That is the law of love.

"Lord, teach us to pray." To fill our whole life with the presence of God we need to talk to Him as we talk to our best friend. And not only from time to time, but regularly, every day. Prayer takes time; it requires us to stop, to distance ourselves from our own needs. In prayer we pause in time by losing it, we take a break in everyday life, we entrust ourselves to God, so that we can find rest in Him. In prayer we find within ourselves the desire to do what God wants us to do. In our times, often overloaded with the number of duties, it is good to hide for a moment in the depths of His heart, and to draw from prayer the Water of Life.

"Lord, teach us to pray ... and He said to them, "When you pray, say..."
