What's all that mean for the Christian steward? As we journey through August, parishes begin to teem with plans and new vitality.

The parish is where the Church lives, and stewards are the lifeblood of a successful parish. In our parish, we find community and support, liturgy and ritual, sacrament and healing. In our parish, we find a way to give and a way to receive. On a practical level, fall is the time when parish planning gears up for the seasons ahead.

What calls to you? Respond to your deep desire. Maybe you have a heart for helping the bereaved. Are you called to lector, or perhaps to take the Eucharist to the homebound? Maybe this is the year you need to soak in the fruits of adult education. Do you have a special way to connect with children and share your faith by being a teacher? Possibly you see a ministry missing and want to propose it.

August is a perfect time to reflect on where – not “if” – you are called. August provides time to decompress from a busy, fun summer and pray about where your own road to discipleship leads you next.

Fr. Thomas's Weekly Reflection

Jesus in this week's Gospel draws our attention to the essence of greed, which is the fear for oneself, a sign of a lack of trust in God, a kind of idolatry, a vice contrasting with love which teaches you to share, give and enrich others rather than yourself. The greed only wants to take, gather and accumulate.

There are many rotten fruits of greed visible in our lives every day. Bribery and corruption, influencing the admission processes at the universities, corrupted politicians available to be "bought", doctors and hospitals falsifying their records to get more from the insurance companies... etc.

The other manifestation of greed is also evident with man-made building disasters, when work is finished before the deadline, but cutting costs leads to using weaker materials, not following the blueprints, or simply skimping on safety.

Greed transpires through theft. Taking possession of something that might be useful, no matter how, no matter who is going to be hurt by it, no matter who is going to be deprived of their right. I want it and I'll do anything to have it.

Because of greed, companies, corporations and private fortunes are raising the salaries of their CEOs, at the expense of regular employees. Leading, through the unemployment, to the breakup of families, depression, and even suicide.

Greed is not always material. Many people desire spiritual experiences. Everyone wants to feel happy and safe, without any worries. That is why more and more people are going to psychotherapists, taking various drugs to be able to artificially free themselves from worries. Because greed is an insatiable desire to have more.

We see that if man allows himself to be overcome with the will to possess at all costs, then greed becomes a god, and a man becomes his servant, a slave. And as a slave, he must do everything to serve his god faithfully.

That's why Jesus Christ gives us a prescription for the unstoppable temptation of greed, "Collect treasures in heaven."
Let us then be witnesses of Jesus through our generous heart and hands, in a helpful gesture of Love.
