Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The readiness to open the door for our Master is called Adoration. Adoration is not only a time of insight into Jesus, but also into ourselves. Mysticism is an art of getting within yourself with the greatest delicacy. Meditation is healing and gifting us with the presence of the intangible preciousness of God. The mystic, standing spiritually in front of God, staring at His eyes, has no chance to hide anything from Him neither from themselves.

One of the most dangerous contemporary threats to our vigilance, to our preparation, to the Master's return is the emergence of occultism, as well as interest in magic, alternative spirituality and Eastern religions. It appears that this phenomenon is a form of a protest against ossified Christianity. Fascination with the occult is a symptom of the insufficiency of the mystical element in our lives. In addition, escaping into distant spiritual planes signifies a desire to escape from oneself, an attempt to deny everything that is carried in the conscience and what is incompatible most often with the ideal vision of oneself. Although Jesus urges believers to meditate on God's word and contemplate the Son of God, He finds few willing ones.

The symbol of prayer or meditation is precisely this lamp or torch, which should be in the hands of those awaiting the return of Christ. The lamp is to illuminate the path to love God alone contemplating, meditating, listening, adoring, and above all the opportunity to see reality! The reality of what's both inside and outside of oneself! The reality of God and man is found in the silence of one's heart. Jesus mentions not only the lighting of the lamps, but also girding the loins as a symbol of prayer. Because prayer expresses our readiness, staying awake to welcome the returning Master.

Jesus calls for evangelical vigilance and readiness. Christian life should be one continuous vigil. In this vigil, in this readiness to go out to meet Christ, Christians are to be like Jews who are ready to leave Egypt as pictured in the Old Testament, in the Book of Exodus. They all had girded hips so that the trailing robes would not obstruct their body movements, and they kept burning torches in their hands to illuminate the darkness of the night.

As an eternal lamp in front of the tabernacle, in front of the monstrance, is a symbol of not only Christ's presence but also our attitude of a faithful servant, so let us make ourselves ready to stand before the Lord by frequent Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, by this gift of having an insight into God and oneself. A moment spent with God will never cease to exist, it will become ours for eternity. A moment in which we avoid our Lord will become an abyss, a black hole that we will never be filled with grace.
