Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

What can one say after reading the words of today's Gospel? Is this supposed to be Jesus' manifesto? A call to fight? An inspiration for an uprising? A push to change the system? The disciples must have thought that Jesus was referring to the secular life, however, He was talking about the fire from Heaven and the desire to fight for God, to choose Him as our guide, our priority, our foundation in faith. We know it from Saint Paul, who in today's second reading, points out to Jesus, who is a model for us, which we should imitate in our lives. Jesus, in order to fulfill the will of the Father, "endured the cross, despising its shame." His life on earth sets the direction for our lives and actions: to serve God and to oppose anything that can distract us from total loyalty to Him.

The words of today's liturgy shock us at first. Jesus explains directly that He came to cast fire on the earth, He also says that He did not come to give peace to the earth but division. It is difficult for us to accept and understand it: fire and division. The element of fire brings the emotions of fear and terror. We are familiar with its destructive power. When it passes, it leaves ruin and ashes behind. We've experienced it recently watching the Notre Damme Cathedral burning before our eyes. Division, the other word Jesus uses, is even worse as it only has a negative connotation.

But is Jesus really bringing such destruction? The Church's teaching explains that this fire is a preview of Christ's sacrifice on the cross. It is the fire of love that is to ignite, cleanse our hearts, and bring ultimate peace, inner peace - a gift from God to His disciples as a sign of harmony between man and God. This fire signifies our adherence to God's will, but it also inspires us to fight and be in opposition to everything that is evil in our own interior - like passions, temptations, sins, or in our environment. All these things defy God's will or weakens our faith and oppose God's plan for us.

On the other hand, our task, the task of everyone who wants to be a disciple of the Lord Jesus, is to build a home, a community based on mutual love. However, one should take into account the fact that human weaknesses and sinfulness will inevitably painfully divide the household. Following Christ, we will often encounter ridicule, be laughed at, be subject to insults and slander. This division is not something Jesus wants, but rather something He's warning us against. He also reminds us that He will strengthen us on that journey and that we are not left alone in our trials and tribulations.

Above all, today's Gospel is a reminder that the spiritual growth of an individual and a community is impossible without challenging ourselves and others. Jesus is a model of this, who ultimately gave up His own life for us. This challenge is a call to set on fire people we encounter in our lives, but to do it always remaining on Jesus' side. This will only be possible if we deepen our personal relationship with Him every day.
