

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

It is not uncommon for a protest or even a rebellion to arise in our minds, seeing how those who are far from God are doing better, are more prosperous and happier. The story of the prodigal son teaches us the principle of God's love and His version of equality. The approach that gives everyone a chance for finding faith and an opportunity for conversion. We are reminded that God applies this principle to all of us, because at some point every one of us has saddened him with our deeds or thoughts.

We can recognize ourselves in the Israelites, who repeatedly turned away from God, yet every time He forgave them and showed them a helping hand. He "relented in the punishment he had threatened to inflict on his people."

We recognize ourselves in the testimony of St. Paul, who in recalling his past, proclaims the mercy that has been shown to him and confesses with humility: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Of these I am the foremost." None of us can say that we do not need conversion. And because of that, the Lord Jesus invites everyone to participate in God's Kingdom by the act of continual conversion which leads us to sanctification. Everyone, even the greatest sinner, is called by God's boundless Love to convert and accept the Mercy of the Father. St. Paul responded fully to God's grace. His life after conversion was one great thanksgiving, because until the end of his life he realized his own weakness in contrast of the greatness of God's mercy.

We see ourselves in the Gospel parables told by Jesus, which emphasize the joy of the man who found what he had lost. Two of them illustrate God's concern for what is small, suffering, lost and in need of help: the shepherd happily bringing back a stray sheep on his shoulders to his flock, and the woman who found the lost coin celebrating together with her neighbors. We see our insignificance in the eyes of the world celebrated by God. Finally the third parable is for us an image of God the Father, who opens his blessing and merciful arms and always awaits his sons and daughters, especially those who have gone missing and are on their way back home, on their way of conversion. No one is insignificant in His eyes, but those who struggle, who suffer, who deal with their problems, which means all of us, receive His support, embrace, strength, comfort, love and mercy. The return of the prodigal son shows us the meeting between God and humanity, mercy and weakness, in the light of love.

The most difficult, however, is to see ourselves in the other, older son. We are striving to be our best, we are remaining with the Father, and yet we do not show love and mercy the way He does. Heavenly Father calls us to be merciful towards each other, after all, He is the Father of us all, including those who err, He wants to give everyone his love and his mercy.

Everyone is equal in God's eyes, because He thinks about us as a whole, as a community, and wants none of us from missing it. We all have equal access to His love and mercy, no matter if we find ourselves far away or close by.
