Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Jesus Christ tells his disciples in the Gospel: "You cannot serve both God and mammon." It seems that this warning first refers to the original meaning of the word mammon, which meant protection, support, certainty, something that people tend to rely on. Over time, the word mammon began to refer strictly to the idol of money and wealth.

In human behavior, we can see a strange relationship: we tend to undertake logical, reflective, and honest action when we are put in unequivocal situations, when it becomes clear that we had previously acted dishonestly. Just like in the parable of the dishonest administrator who is aware that his dismissal is inevitable. Only then does he really open his eyes and notice the difficulty of his position. In the light of the question from his employer he sees dishonesty in his behavior. Until now, he had used his position to waste his master's property for his own purposes. Now he knows that he has lost his trust and - as a result - his position.

Jesus, however, praises this dishonest steward. Obviously not for misusing the goods of others and making friends at the expense of the employer, but only for his foresight; the ingenuity with which he resolved the difficult situation and did not give into doubt. The steward finds a way out of the trouble. Until now, he hardly noticed the existence of others, he only thought about himself and his interests. Now he discovers the value of friendship. He save himself by being open to others. And it is his forethought, openness to other people, that is praised, not the ways he uses to secure his future.

As disciples of Jesus, we should act with the same foresight, dexterity and openness to others as the evangelical steward did. It often happens, however, that when it comes to the decisions regarding the sublime matters of our salvation, then we, the children of light, do not make radical and critical decisions. We become lazy, slothful and slow to react. We do not have sufficient energy and motivation for bold changes. Let us trust in God's providence again today. Let us remember that if in our lives we choose eternity - we must learn to treat worldliness only in terms of preparation, trial, path or measure, but never - the goal. We cannot serve both God and mammon, because it's God who should be our protection, support, certainty, something that we should rely on. And that should be our goal.

"I plead with you — never, ever give upon hope, never doubt, never tire, and never become discouraged. Be not afraid"
