Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Do we need faith? Indeed, and we need a lot of it. Without faith existence is unbearable. And it's not just about believing in anything, but about the faith in the power of Jesus to influence our lives. "When Man ceases to worship God he does not worship nothing but worships everything" (G.K. Chesterton). When crosses are removed, people hang amulets in their place. In modern times, when it seems that we're witnessing the triumph of rationalism and authority of science, even people in charge of the fate of countries and states give evidence of faith in the most absurd things. Presidents consulting astrologers regarding most significant problems, Wall Street shareholders making their decisions based on horoscopes, state officials being enthusiast of reflexology or believing in conspiracy theories regarding the UFOs and even claiming to have seen them.

When I was in the seminary, as a religious education teacher at a parish across the street, I've noticed with surprise that among the sources of information most often cited by students were movies, and when I pointed out that pretty much all they were talking about was fiction, they said, "Yes, but based on facts." It all reminds us that we cannot live without faith, but we need to seriously think about what and who we believe.

Faith is the deposit entrusted to us. It obliges us to see things the way Jesus sees them. Faith was not given to us to tear trees out and throw them into the sea, or to flatten down the mountains, or to call on the avengers team, or to believe in green or grey creatures from outer space, etc. You cannot believe Him and everything else at the same time. To believe Jesus and in Jesus should be enough to need nothing anymore. Charles de Foucault, talking about faith said: "we owe one thing to the Lord: that we no longer need to be afraid of anything".

The Apostles' plea: "Lord, increase our faith" is a call that often comes from the soul of man. There are times in life when we know that only God can help us, only to Him we can turn because He will hear us. Living faith implies a bond, a relationship of closeness, prayer understood as conversation, encounter with God. God expects us to turn to Him, and then our faith strengthens. Without God's presence, without His word, our everyday life not only loses its sense, but is often inexplicable, it can come dangerously close to absurdity. For true fulfillment and understanding only takes place in Christ, who is the beginning and end of our life.
