# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Among the words that get less and less prominent in our everyday lives is a short "thank you", which is clearly associated with gratitude. We know that words of gratitude are affirming, which is a human need. But, we know from our own experience that often the word "thank you" does not want to go through our throat. Perhaps we are losing the natural response to the generosity being received. I was surprised to hear from a mother of an altar server, at the parish I was visiting, after her son served at Mass, that he had never been thanked for his service before. I thought it could be a sign that we become similar to the nine lepers from today's Gospel. "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?"

A sense of gratitude is not only a manifestation of good manners, but an attitude that is a measure of the size of a man, his selflessness and nobility. A grateful man is the one who sees that he does not owe everything to himself, that he is part of a community to which he owes almost everything, in some way he should be aware that he is the debtor of others, that he should be grateful for everything. And this creates a sense of joy and happiness.

When we look at the healed lepers in today's Gospel, we can also discover in them the motives of our own behavior. The Samaritan - a foreigner - was the only one who appreciated God's grace, His gift and love. The other nine did not see the act of giving and focused only on their restored health, like a small child on a gift received rather than on the gesture of the one giving. The nine who were healed from leprosy behaved like the ungrateful majority they are greedy egoists and think that they deserve everything for free.

What is the basis of our ingratitude? Putting ourselves in the center of our lives is the first problem. This develops the misconception that we owe everything to ourselves, to our abilities, our intellect or skills. It hides from us the truth about seeking and finding God in all things. Today, people have learned to complain and often express their dissatisfaction and frustration instead of giving thanks. We forget that complaining is contagious and can contaminate, acidify people around and destroy their ability to see good, truth and beauty.

Gratitude is an invitation for us to keep our eyes open, attentive and focused to see God and His love for us everywhere. In every Mass the call is made: "Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God" and the faithful answer: "It is right and just." God is worthy to thank Him. Every Eucharist is an opportunity not only to ask but also to awaken the attitude of gratitude. And show that the Divine Benefactor remains the most important for us. Let's also try to see the gifts from others this week, and show them our gratitude for that.
