Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection


Rapid changes in everyday reality, which make it difficult for us to adapt, cause us to constantly chase after something. We are afraid to stop or even to slow down, facing the possibility of being overtaken by others, fearing the smallest chance of falling out in competition. We are afraid to lose what we have managed to snatch from life. We are like bottomless bags, no matter how much we put in, it will still be not enough. Why? Because man is by nature a seeking creature.

One of those seekers is introduced to us in today's Gospel. Zaccheus is a very rich man. As a chief tax collector, he is responsible not only for hiring other officials in his area, but also determining the amount of duty for the goods sold. His position provided him with a substantial income, however, he was disrespected by Israelites for cooperating with the Roman Empire. Although Zacchaeus is spiritually far from Jesus, he wants to see Him. To achieve it, he climbs the sycamore tree so as not to miss the moment of Jesus' passing. Luke mentions this encounter to draw our attention to the sense of Jesus' mission. It is to find those who are lost in their life's paths and who have been pushed away by people and convicted to condemnation.

Zacchaeus' attitude very clearly points to the fact that meeting Jesus can change one's life, even a person who is from a human perspective - a lost case. The sign of a new life, the sign of conversion is his willingness to repair the damage he has done before. Zacchaeus did not have to, but wanted to give half of his possessions to the needy. Jesus never asked him to repay so much to those he had stolen from. But he did it, on his own, because he met the Savior. And it was not just an empty declaration, because Jesus says: Today, salvation has come to this house. Perhaps Zacchaeus' conversion moved his family so much that everyone accepted God's salvation through faith in Jesus. Zacchaeus experiences joy because the encounter has changed his way of looking at life and was a moment of granting him an inner freedom in relation to his possessions.

Jesus Christ was sent into the world by a loving Father. And everyone who believes in Him has eternal life. One can encounter Jesus through openness to grace and internal conversion. Entering Jesus' path is not so much the merit of man, but rather the anticipatory grace of God. Change in Zacchaeus' life is an effect of him being shown a personal attention and respect.

God always looks forward to meeting us, He looks up our own "sycamore tree". But not only that: He comes out to meet us where we are at, becomes man himself, becomes one of us. To change our lives we need to personally encounter God's love. Then we will have the chance to discover that God gives us the grace to start over, even in the time of experiencing the greatest difficulties in our lives.
