

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" This is happening just before the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. However, prophet Isaiah seven centuries earlier exclaimed: a voice of one crying out in the desert, prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. And also today's preachers encourage in a similar way: Convert! Repent! The millennia of history were filled with the same cry. Do people still need to be called out, persuaded, encouraged to change their ways? Yes. Since the day of the drama under the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil until today, we all need the change of life, in conduct and in thought. And there were always those who said: We have Abraham as our father – as if that meant: we are perfect and we do not need pay attention to those call, we don't need to listen. John the Baptist rebukes them saying: God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones.

Shortly afterwards, with the same call, Jesus stood among his countrymen. Then, after His resurrection He sent His apostles to the ends of the world to proclaim that same message. In the first speech of the apostle Peter, on the day of Pentecost, he cries out: *Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins*.

Sometimes I wonder how big were the crowds listening to John over the Jordan? *Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him* – after all it's a small part of the modern world. And the word *whole* is quite possibly an exaggeration, fairly common and characteristic for the authors of that day and age. Similarly, nobody exactly counted those three thousand baptized after Peter's speech, and tens of thousands of pilgrims were coming to Jerusalem for the Feast. In that light, those numbers don't impress us too much. It is similar in our days. We see so much moral evil, dirt and disorder in the world. Crimes against life. Sins against the family. Property abuse. Manipulation of the truth - to name only these four fundamental values. Does the conversion of individuals, or even thousands out of millions, mean anything? Especially that those who have the greatest influence on shaping the public opinion and promoting the best practices, often do not reach the minimum moral level themselves. What meaning will then my conversion have? Maybe it is not worth bothering with it at all?

Whatever was written previously was written for our instruction, that by endurance and by the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. The apostle Paul writes about hope to the Romans and to us. Hope can be weak, fragile and fading. We shouldn't be surprised. Evil seems to have the upper hand. But that is exactly why hope must be upheld, strengthened, kindled. And this is the task of us, Christians. That is why I am not asking if my conversion or my effort towards good will change the world. Hope is the conviction that God will see in everyone even a smallest instance of good and will integrate it into His great work of Creation and Redemption.

We're experiencing another Advent in our lives - a time of hope. Everyone crying for centuries: *Repent!* were and are a people of hope. They know that when one man converts, the whole world gets better. Because the growth of the Kingdom of Heaven is not measured by human statistics.
