Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Today, the Church celebrates the Epiphany, or the revelation of Jesus to the world. The Magi represent the peoples of the whole world, all languages and countries, which, summoned by the Lord, set out on the road to adore the Newborn in Bethlehem. In contrast, the enlightened priests and scribes who are not far away to the place when the New King is born do not make a single step towards it. A wise men, lead by a star, are encouraged by the light that illuminates their path, showing them the way.

Priests and scribes know the Scripture well. That's how they know about the prophecies indicating the birthplace of the king of Israel. However, they cannot tell Herod anything beyond mere prophetic information. So we are dealing with a kind of paradox. On the one hand, we see a mysterious star that guides the three Gentiles to the Savior. On the other hand, we have the Word of God, read and taught by Old Testament priests and scribes in such a way that nothing can be given to Herod except for the vague information.

The wise men arrived in Bethlehem because they allowed themselves to be lead by the star. It is important to learn to observe in our everyday life the signs through which God speaks to us, calls us and directs us. As a gift to Jesus, the wise men brought royal gifts: gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold symbolizes that what is beautiful, glorious and valuable. It recognizes the dignity of Jesus as a king. Incense is used in temples as a symbol of prayer. It indicates that Jesus is God. Myrrh is a balm used to anoint the dead and added to the wine to strengthen it. Such a drink was given to convicts. This is a preview of the Lord's passion and his funeral. Jesus therefore received gold as king, incense as God and myrrh as man.

The Gospel states that the Magi, after meeting Jesus, *they departed for their country by another way*. Such a change of route can mean the conversion that those who meet Christ are called to. This entails imitating His mode of action, making of oneself a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God.

What God has revealed to Mary, Joseph, shepherds and Magi on Christmas night, Epiphany wants to preach from the roof-tops of the world. The grotto in Bethlehem is not a "private property", but a common good of all people. Christianity brings salvation to everyone, because Christ is the true Son of the living God. And the ultimate sense of the Christian calling is for people to find the way to Christ.
