Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Peter and Andrew, for many years, were casting their nets day and night, but they had little success. When Jesus appeared on the shore of the lake, He gave their lives new perspective, a new sense, and this attracted them. Only God can give a new meaning to our existence. Only God makes life thrilling and fascinating, worth abandoning immediately everything else that was done before.

It is thanks to Jesus, His presence in our lives, that we can find fulfillment, even in the most mundane form, but He is after something more. He wants to fish us out from the sea of the earthly worries or catch those drowning in their sins and show them the new hope. In today's short fishing episode, we see how wonderful God is in Jesus Christ. He uncovered a new dimension of life for these brothers, helped them see something infinitely more beautiful than seaweed, fish fins, strings of nets and salty sweat. He helped Peter and Andrew raise their aspirations higher. From the seabed to the unfathomable sky.

There are thousands of people around us who can't cope with life, see no prospects, and even lose their hope in God. Entangled in the nets of powerlessness and meaninglessness, they lean towards despair and self-denial. They are like fish caught up in a net: lost in taxes, in a mobile network, in a world wide web, in a net of addictions, toxic emotions, childhood wounds, debts, and finally a chain of sins. Who will pull them up?

Jesus called two brothers, not Peter himself, because we need companionship and it happens that when we help each other we also often help ourselves. But in order to have others untangled, we must be freed by Jesus first. That is why Jesus first untied Peter and Andrew from their nets, and only then told them to go and fish for men, to bring them to a new life in the Spirit. It is true that a sense of the value of life can come from being helpful to others. It is worth living with the knowledge that we helped someone get out of the bottom. Here is a carpenter from Nazareth, who in a few words helped simple fishermen to get out of their tangled fate and made them leaders of the people, but above all He gave them a promise of eternal life. He did not say: follow me to help ME become a great religious leader, but he said: follow me and I will make YOU leaders who will be instrumental in saving others.

The Church is a community that in patience works on drawing others up. Jesus taught Peter and Andrew the leadership that is not manipulating others, but serving them to lift them up. This is the meaning of the Christian leadership. Many people pull up the ladder after reaching their career peaks, but Christ shows us something completely different. Not only pulls others from the bottom, but puts them on the top.
