Fr. Tomas's Weekly Reflection

Jesus' face shone like the sun. The sun gives light, gives life, gives energy. We need the face of God in order to get rid of all the masks we wear in everyday life. This is the only face before which you cannot pretend to be someone else than you really are. When His face shone like the sun, Peter, James, and John fell on their faces. When His true face appeared, they covered their own faces, and then, when they raised their eyes, without fear, they saw no one but Jesus Himself. To see no one but God.

The face of a man is the reflection of his soul. Everything inside is painted on it. This is the only part of the body that is always naked, always exposed. We cover our bodies, put on shoes, gloves, hats, however, we hardly ever cover our faces. They are exposed and they show everything that we have hidden inside; hidden not only from others, but also from ourselves. Feelings, thoughts, premonitions, attitudes and, above all, the spirit that governs us, all this is revealed in the look, shape of the lips, arrangement of muscles, eyebrows, color of the cheeks. Yet we hide them sometimes, cover them with masks...

It might be workaholicism, tobacco, alcohol, drug addiction, watching TV, escaping into the virtual world, gluttony, shopping, pornography, emotional addiction, addiction to mobile devices or even mp3s, to lies and narcissistic need to be admired. All this causes us to put on our masks, and it is difficult even to know which one to wear, because they keep on changing with time. And probably soon we will learn about some new ones that keep the real human face hidden.

Christ reveals his face so that we can see our own face without fear. We need the revelation of God's face to regain our own faces, to uncover them from underneath the masks we wear. In the discovery of God's omnipotence, man is most helped to discover his own powerlessness, his weakness. After the dazzling revelation of Jesus' face, the disciples lifted their faces from the ground. To lift our faces from the ground, from the fall, without fear, is something that many of us can only dream about, because when we look in the mirror we no longer see ourselves, but the mask. Jesus reveals His face to remind us that we need to stop being ashamed of ourselves. He lets us raise our heads, remove our masks, not with pride, but with dignity. When He addresses His disciples asking them to rise up and not be afraid, it becomes His call to all mankind to tear the masks we wear and to reveal our own faces created in God's image and likeness.

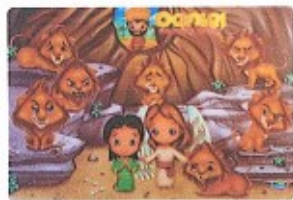
