The Fifth Station

Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry his cross. Are we resentful when we volunteer and others do not? Does it bother us to carry the financial burden of the parish when others who could refuse? We see in Simon, who may have been a reluctant volunteer, a man whose good deed is remembered in his favor for generations. Our good deeds can have a lasting effect as well.

The Sixth Station

Veronica wipes the face of Jesus. Do we know how to receive the kindness of others? Jesus did in his humility. Learning to give is matched by our ability to receive. Are we grateful for the kindness of others even as we are grateful for the kindness of God in our lives? Do we help those in need? Do we see Jesus in the least of our brothers and sisters?

The Seventh Station

Jesus falls the second time. Greed causes many people to fall. Jesus rises from the fall, as we are to rise from our sins of greed. Does our greed teach others to fall? Avarice is a capital sin along with pride and envy. Greed causes us to create other sins such as sins against justice and charity. Does our preoccupation with material goods blind us to the reality of God?

The Eighth Station

Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem. Jerusalem, as a location, can cause us to think of the whole world. Are we good stewards of the earth? Do we steal from future generations the resources they will need? Do we respect the property rights of others? We are stewards for providence which means that we need to share our benefits with others, especially with the poor of our own locality and beyond.
