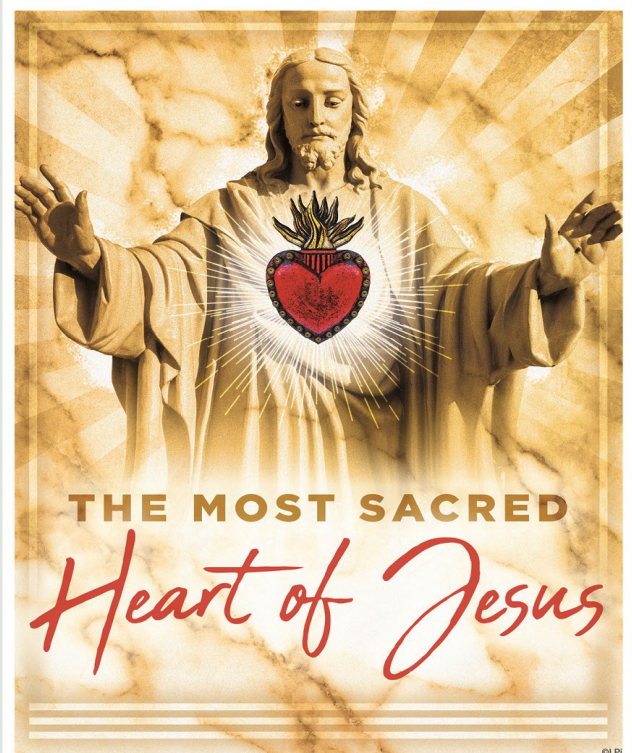

REFLECT

FIRST READING

Moses reminds the Israelites of how God's miraculous gifts of manna (bread) and water (early images of the Eucharist) helped them through their trials and tribulations. How would you explain to a friend how the Eucharist sustains you through difficult times?

SECOND READING

Paul spoke of how the believers in Corinth celebrating the Eucharist were engaged in an act of "participation" in the Body and Blood of Christ. How do you imagine the Corinthians reacting to this description?

GOSPEL READING

We hear in today's Gospel the closing remarks from Jesus' Bread of Life discourse. As a Christian who believes in the Eucharist, how would you answer the Jews' original question: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?"

Fr. Thomas's Weekly Reflection

Corpus Christi, or in full the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, focuses our attention on the Eucharist as a feast and as a lasting presence of God in the Blessed Sacrament. Beginning with the first Christians communities, the Eucharistic feast was always celebrated as a communal experience. The word Communion recognizes the connection not only between us and Christ, but also with one another.

The Eucharist is the gift Jesus makes of himself, because *He loved us to the end*. Thanks to His presence in the Sacrament, He fulfills the promise of being with us until the end of the age. He remained with us in the simplicity of bread and wine. In this way He wanted to show us that His real Body and His real Blood can be made available to us. Consuming it we achieve the union with God through the Eucharist.

The quality of our relationship not only with God, but also with our fellow men depends on the way we participate in the Eucharist. For if the time of the Eucharistic gathering is for us only an external ritual, during which our attention wanders to many places, we should be questioning ourselves whether we treat the Eucharist simply as an object. An important object, but not a Person. Even a sacred object, but a piece of bread that we eat and immediately forget about it, overwhelmed by our busy everyday life. Treating Jesus as if He was a thing, we also begin to treat others as objects that can be used to improve our well-being. Participation in the Holy Mass gives us the comfort of fulfilling our religious obligation, just like our human relationships can help us achieve our personal satisfaction.

Actively and consciously participating in the Eucharist we feel the sense of belonging to the Church, to the People of God, to the Body of the Lord, to Jesus Christ. And while we will never fully understand its value and wealth, we know that it obligates all of us to receive Holy Communion often and with great dignity, in order to become like bread for others. Let us pray to Christ our Lord that this Sacrament of the Altar will keep His presence alive in the Church and shape our communities in love and unity, according to the heart of the Father.
