Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Nowadays, the value of material goods is vastly overestimated. Many people cannot forgive themselves if they have just but scratched their car, because it has almost become an object of worship for them. Others get angry when a child accidentally breaks some expensive glass or something similar. We fall victims to things or situations way too easily. A failed exam can cause a teenager to experience suicidal thoughts; a bad breakup may inspire to fall into a depression; body image becomes an obsession, to look better, younger, slimmer, fitter - so much money is being spent in order to improve the external appearance.

Let's look at this in the context of today's Gospel. What does Jesus mean by saying: *do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul*. Jesus wants us to understand how much God cares for everyone and how great human dignity is. Our task is to find the right hierarchy of values, a good balance between the physical and the spiritual element of our lives.

In many verses of the Scripture we find beautiful passages praising God as our refuge, shelter, defense and consolation, and today's Gospel makes us specifically reflect on what is really important in our human existence. The evangelist emphasizes the transcendent reality of God's gentleness and care for all of us, His fatherly attributes. Jesus, in His rhetoric, desires to have us realize that God is interested not only in all humanity at large, but also in the fate of every single human being. He wants us to understand how each of us is important to God and that God cares for each person individually. Since God cares for every creature, even the smallest, like grass in the fields or sparrows, His fatherly concern embraces all the more every human being. But most importantly, His concern is for the good of every human soul.

Unfortunately, many people neglect taking care of anything that involves soul and spirit. We do not think about the immortality of our souls neither our eternal lives. We are more concerned about the state of our body than about the state of our spirit. We satisfy our physical needs, but do we even realize that the spiritual hunger exists at all? We need to take time every day for a short examination of conscience, to intentionally cultivate our own interior life. It's not a fad, but a necessity.
