We are currently enrolling 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade for the new school year!


This is, of course, the most exciting part of our work, and we are always looking for new applicants. If you know a student that would relish the enriching, Catholic education that we are offering, let us know!





Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

There is more to the story than just pure luck in case of both discoveries in the parable Jesus tells in today's Gospel. Both men were indeed lucky to find something of a great value, treasure or pearl, but also both had to sell everything they had in order to take the possession of that new-found value. Everything. They went all in. They accepted the risk, as they haven't left any safe sum of money on the side. There is some madness in it, it's brave and daring. Both cases show that building a life on God comes at a cost. Yes, we have to invest in God in a way. What do we invest? Our life, our time, our strength, abilities, and sometimes health or money. This disturbing word: *everything* haunts us here. Why is it so difficult for us to believe that by entrusting everything to God, we can in turn gain everything that matters? Maybe because it's not so obvious. Faith has always a hint of risk to it. It has nothing to do with calculation.

When we discover God in our lives, everything else loses its value. Both parables remind us about it. And it is not about the decisions that are made in a spontaneous act of trust, neither does it come from the experience, but rather it's about the result of a continued pursuit and desire for more, that God plants in our heart and wants us to discover. An interesting detail that might get overlooked is that one of the characters in the parable made his decision *out of joy*. This is an important detail. The discovery of God is always bringing us joy. And if there is joy in our faith, we are more likely to eagerly forfeit everything for the sake of it.

On the surface it may seem that there is a difference between the two parables, that the man who discovered the treasure in the field did it by accident, by pure luck, while that merchant was actively looking for pearls, perhaps for many years, until he finally found the most valuable one. The reality is that each conversion, the discovery of God, is ultimately allowed by an accompanying grace. God Himself chooses the time, place and way. What might be perceived as a lucky accident, may in fact be a result of many years of preparation that preceded the discovery, the time that is known only to God Himself.

The thing that depends on us, however, is to be attentive in order not to miss the right moment. The Greeks called it *Kairos* - a moment of happiness, enchantment, delight, as opposed to the time of ordinary monotony, routine, everyday life - *Chronos*. God forbid, if I had missed my *Kairos* due to my absent-mindedness, lack of attention or lack of diligence...
