

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In every situation in our life, in every moment, in every activity, not only when things go wrong, but also when they are generally good, God speaks to us, instructs us or calls us, waiting for us to respond. The foundation of our dialogue with God is the limitless trust in Him, putting ourselves in His hands. In a conversation between man and God, the initiative belongs to God himself. The basic response we're responsible for is our attentive listening to the His Word and Faith in Him

We need to ask ourselves: how are we to listen, hear, understand, and accept this Word? Often in our understanding, God is very distant, we see Him as the Creator, ruler, emperor, often portrayed as a kind old man with a long gray beard, but always somewhat removed from our daily reality, irrelevant, unfitting... But we need to remember that He is, in fact, very close, close in Jesus Christ who became our brother, giving His life for our salvation, and who himself is the Word of God offered to us, the realization of God's initiating role in the dialogue.

The events described in today's Gospel inspire reflection on the importance of a personal prayer in dealing with life's challenges and difficulties. After meeting the crowd and feeding them, Jesus left his disciples to find some peace. He finds it in prayer. In communication with the Father, in a dialogue with God. The importance of a personal prayer life is clearly emphasized here. Its healing power restores spiritual balance. This is why there's no such thing as a bad time for prayer, there's no being too tired to pray, there's no such thing as not having enough time to pray. If a prayer is perceived as an authentic conversation with God, there can be no excuses. Prayer elevates human kind to God, our minds and hearts, to our Creator. It can be said that God himself has established prayer as a source of union with Him, but even more so, as a source of life for us. After all, it is thanks to Him that we exist, live and function. Therefore, we need to use this privilege of having a dialogue with Him, thanking Him for everything He allows us to experience.

Having established the nature of prayer, we need to also look at its purpose. The second episode in today's Gospel describes the Apostles' struggle with nature. While trying to cross to the other side of the lake, they encountered the storm, the wind that blew against them. And once again God comes with an initiative, engages them in a dialogue, reaches out to them. Life of prayer is our source of strength while facing difficulties. Some people struggle with their life problems in vain, others realize that God extends His hands towards them, and draw their strength from prayer, from the relationship with Him, in order to be able to survive and overcome the difficulties. God offers help, but we need to become aware of it. By focusing on ourselves and the challenges, it is often difficult to notice Jesus walking up towards us to help us. By an act of prayer, we shift the focus onto God, which allows us to pick up His outstretched hand. We just need more courage and faith to pray more often.
