Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Jesus' question in today's Gospel contained also an answer to another one. The one who will show the knowledge and certainty of Jesus' divinity would become the rock on which He will establish His Church. Simon Peter did not come to know Jesus through his own intellectual efforts. God the Father revealed it to him, and through it the Father revealed whom he sees as the foundation of the Church to come. It was a sign to Jesus and His Apostles. From that moment on, not only did Simon know who Jesus was, but Jesus also knew Peter better. The more he got to know Jesus, the more he was gifted with a new spiritual identity. The name change is the best indication of this.

We can discover ourselves by entering the depths of Jesus' Heart. The more we get to know Jesus, the more clearly we will see who we are. When Peter spoke aloud what he recognized in Christ, Jesus spoke out what he saw in Peter. The key to knowing God turned out to be the same key that had the power to open Simon's heart. Human beings can be closed in themselves, to themselves and to others, until they open themselves to the desire to know God in Jesus Christ. It is amazing that by entering into a relationship with God, we see more deeply into ourselves.

All the more, however, we are astonished by Christ's remark at the end of the passage. He strongly urges them not to tell anyone that He is the Messiah. The intimacy of revelation is locked by the key of discretion. It is too valuable for that discovery to be made just as regular and ordinary as any other news, gossip, piece of information. Mere curiosity is not enough to become the key to heaven's gates. In fact, the pursuit after sensations opens the gates of hell, which are full of scandalous biographies. God in Jesus is not a sensation, but a revelation for His most intimate friends. For those who are with him always, for better or for worse. That is why Jesus immediately prophesied about his martyrdom and death.

The prohibition of spreading the newly acquired knowledge of Jesus preserves the mystery only for a limited time, but it also has a different meaning. It is about respecting the truth about Jesus as God himself. A self-respecting, law-abiding Jew will not say God's name out loud. Only after Jesus' Resurrection, He commanded His disciples to proclaim the saving truth about Him to the whole world.

Thus far, Peter has only seen the depth of the truth about Jesus, but has not yet experienced it. Just knowing about Christ is not enough. Only experience completes the revelation and entitles to apostleship. Admiring mountain peaks from a valley is not the same as climbing them. Being an apostle requires not only seeing Jesus and knowing who He is, but more importantly, experiencing Him in the scandal of the cross and in the glory of the Resurrection. An apostle who knows who Jesus is but does not want to experience the cross remains merely a bystander. This is why we should not be surprised at the words of Jesus who later calls Peter Satan. It takes some time for Peter to fully accept the call to the Apostleship. But we know that he finally passes the test of the cross...
