# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

When Peter heard from Jesus of His upcoming passion, rejection, but also resurrection, he tried to kindly "influence" Jesus' decision. It's easy to believe in Jesus triumphant, but when He speaks of the defeat and even death, we tremble and insist so that it does not happen. Imagine a king leading his soldiers to a battle, telling them that they will not come of it alive. Even if he knew it was the truth, he would never say it.

Peter's concern for the well-being of Jesus is an expression of his own hidden egocentrism: he focuses on his satisfaction stemming out of Jesus' success. Most likely Peter was really concerned about Jesus' fate, but he was also afraid that he would have to suffer with Him. Jesus tells Peter that he is a hindrance and in the Greek version of the Gospel of Matthew there is no hesitation to use the very disturbing word: *Skandalon*, that refers to "any person or thing by which one is (entrapped) drawn into error".

There is a great need to shift our thinking from the desire to be satisfied to the desire to be real. We live in the world where many people want to be someone else, or pretend to be someone else, or live life as if they were not themselves, just to be satisfied, to feel good. Meanwhile being real is much more important than being content. Jesus could respond to Peter's persuasion by taking care of his own life, but where would we all end up then

In the second reading, Paul requests from his addressees a radical change of mind, he uses the word *Metanoia* that can be translated as transformation, or a fundamental change. In the first reading on the other hand, Jeremiah tries to extinguish this process of transformation, and he trembles with fear of having his interior molded in the fire of the truth of God's words, to the point of being true to the people of Jerusalem. Sometimes being true or being real may cost us our life. If I'm real I'll be hated someday, if I don't want to be hated, I have to live in a hypocrisy. This is why Paul warns against following the world, the times, fashion, trends, and to transform our minds to please God. And what can be more pleasing to God than the truth. If Jesus had listened to Peter's advice, He would have become a hypocrite and people's pleaser, a popular rabbi recognized for his miracles and astounding erudition.

The most important is, however, that the effect of the transformation Paul is talking about goes way beyond the Golgotha, way beyond death. While today Peter does not understand even the word *resurrection*, a few months later, at Mount Tabor transfigured Jesus revealed to him the truth. Whoever sees the truth themselves can open the eyes of others. We are not only to find Jesus for ourselves, but to persuade as many as possible to that change: from seeking self-satisfaction to looking for the truth.
