

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Love comes with an ability of telling a difficult truth to our loved ones. On the other hand, there is no love in avoiding challenging topics, especially regarding someone's persistence in sin. Love in our modern times is usually understood as something "nice", a form of flattery and acceptance of everything. However, love does not only consist of tenderness but also a rebuke. St. Paul in his letters expressed not only gentleness towards his spiritual children, but also chastisement and discipline. We are told that if we want to love, we have to keep distance - so as not to hurt and not to be hurt.

It takes courage to differ in opinion. The courage to love is also the courage to recognize the differences. And if there are differences there is going to be anger and frustration as well. A love that tries to avoid anger is false. True love gets angry and frustrated because it's real, and it does not stop loving. When I hear individuals accusing themselves of being angry with their family members, I think to myself: "Okay, you got angry, but does that mean you stopped loving that person in your moment of anger? Or maybe you got angry because you care, because you want absolutely the best for that person." I would be more concerned if parents didn't get angry when their children are doing what is wrong. When we are afraid to experience pain in love, we transform it into a false sense of peace.

On the other hand, if I claim to love and never get concerned about the person I say I love, most likely I got used to the evil. So evil does not impress me anymore, does not irritate me, or maybe I'm justifying it or finding excuses.

There is difference between love and pretending. We have to examine our consciences regarding the reality of our love. It's simple: Do I love or am I trying to please someone at all costs? Do I love or only like? Do I love or am I giving in to the societal pressure to consider love only what is pleasant? Do I love or do I pretend?

Love sometimes requires a difficult word of truth, needs a painful remainder of an error. But will my brother listen? Or will his response be: "Mind your own business! My life, my choices, my mistakes! Stop telling me what to do!" No matter what you will hear, it's always your business if you love someone. Our lives are intertwined and interconnected. We all bear the consequences of every decision! Because as Christians, we are like connected vessels: we either grow together to holiness, or we bring each other down.

Yes! It is my business! I can and sometimes have to, in the name of love, take responsibility for the salvation of my neighbor! Nevertheless, always remembering the words of the St. Paul: *Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another*. We have to live the truth in order to love! To correct having in mind the good of our neighbor, his edification, strengthening, and ultimately his salvation.




