## Fr. Thomas's Weekly Reflection

Sometimes, when we get invited by someone or are encouraged to do something, we take time to think and discern how we should respond, because we might be afraid of the expenses or responsibilities related to the invitation. It can also happen that we reject the invitation because of the very person who invites us.

Today all the readings inspire us to reflect on our response to a special invitation to a feast, to an eternal feast. Isaiah, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, announces to us the foretelling of the endless feast God is preparing for us, believing in Him, at the end of times. *The LORD of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines, juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines.* This celebration we are all invited to, is the banquet for all those who do God's will, who respond to His goodness and His Love. It is a reward of eternal joy for the people He calls His own, where *the Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from every face; the reproach of his people He will remove from the whole earth; for the LORD has spoken.*

We can learn a lot regarding the acceptance of an invitation from Saint Paul, who converted on the way to Damascus, and ever since adhered to Christ to such an extent that he was not afraid of any adversities. He tells us that those who unconditionally accept the invitation from God, in any circumstances and in all things, will learn the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need. However, despite that realization he encourages us by his own experience when he says: *I can do all things in Him who strengthens me.* This is an attitude that should be imitated.

Finally, the Gospel culminates the theme of invitation to a feast by providing us with the vision of our encounter with God at the end of our lives. We are all invited to celebrate together in the Heavenly Kingdom. However, it's not about any reaction to the invite. It is about a very specific response of readiness, signified in the parable by a particular dress code at the wedding. The king's words intended for one of the guests also apply to us: *My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?* The response to invitation to be a part of God's Kingdom is not enough, we have to dress appropriately. It's the quality of the response that matters. We need to wrap ourselves in prayer, faith, love, and most of all Sacraments, to be able to worthily enter the Eternal Banquet.

*"These students are banding together to challenge each other to learn more. They play off each other so their knowledge builds. It is really inspiring to see."*


