Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

A Roman Denarius, like any coin, had two sides. The imperial image was engraved on one of them. Meanwhile, the image of God is engraved in man. After all we are created in His image and likeness. Therefore, while we are giving to the "emperor" our earthly possessions, we can still keep a spotless conscience for God. But how many of us today, when making our daily decisions, ask our conscience for advice? How many make choices at the level of conscience regarding important, universal matters?

Jesus' saying *repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God*, expresses the perennial problem of the presence of Christians in the world; the desire for an answer to the question of the relationship between the state and the Church. The Gospel and its message, has shaped the daily life of Christians over the centuries. The problem of the modern world, and specifically Christianity today, is that we have gone so far away from the source, that we often no longer understand the words of Jesus. And even worse: we are unable to translate them into our lives.

Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God indicates stripping the civil ruler from any attempts of deification, and at the same time reminds us about the truth that the power of civil authority reaches as far as their money goes. This was in fact the very reason and meaning of placing the image of the emperor on the coin, so that the subjects would remember who is in charge.

Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God also states that everything belongs to God, even though officials, political parties, regimes, etc. would like to claim their divine attributes. Jesus deprives them of any sacredness, because the only Lord is God, and the earthly rulers are at best God's tenants. For centuries, Christians have paid for the adherence to this truth with their blood. Wherever earthly power rebels against God's ownership of everything and usurps authority over it, God opposes it, and with Him, His followers cannot remain silent.

Following the voice of our own conscience, we often face decisions, choices between the earthly and the divine. We take part in parliamentary, presidential or local elections, and we are given the privilege to decide what is going to be more important in our lives and what foundations our everyday life will be built on. We often underestimate that the shape of this everyday life is in our hands. Therefore, we need to ask ourselves today: what will be more important? What belongs to Cesar, or what belongs to God?
