

A Classical, Catholic Education

What is classical curriculum?

A classical curriculum is chronologically synchronous education which is designed to **educate the child holistically**.

Beginning with the first written documents of human history and working its way through Western Civilization's most prominent thinkers, our rigorous curriculum ultimately helps students to engage with the most fundamental human questions.

Why classical curriculum?

A classical education helps students **engage with their cultural heritage so that they can understand their own history** and be able to enter the world with a foundational knowledge of how and why the world has begun to think in the way that it has.

Moreover, a classical education aims to form students in their ability to think clearly and to write and speak coherently, persuasively, and beautifully. In this regard, a classical education creates the opportunity to engage deeply with the realities of beauty, truth, and goodness.

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Believe it or not, we can decide in our lives whether we want to be happy or not. Most people think that education, family, social status and money will make them happy. Turns out this is not the case. On the other hand, God wants man to be happy by becoming like Him as much as possible. That is why Jesus invites his disciples today to the Mount of Beatitudes, to open their hearts to God's love poured out by the Holy Spirit. If we were to summarize the message of the entire Gospel, we would see a certain dynamic of life in it. It implies following Jesus on the path of the Beatitudes, the way of happiness, the way of holiness. It is a path against the tide, but it leads to heaven. And on this path, every Christian, insofar as he sanctifies himself, becomes more fruitful for the world.

If we were to answer the question of how can one become a saint, after reading today's Gospel it should be simple: one must, in their own way, open themselves to what Jesus preaches in the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes are, in a way, a constitution of the Kingdom of God. In them we see reflected the face of God, the face we are called to show to the entire world in our daily life. The Beatitudes are a commentary to the commandments of the Decalogue, and represent a deeper understanding of God's law. They are every saint's identity. Therefore, they should be also the content of our lives. We can live by them only when we allow ourselves to be led by the Holy Spirit, who permeates us with all His power and sets us free from the weaknesses of selfishness, laziness, and pride.

Jesus makes us aware that if we do not turn to God, by courageously accepting the challenge from the Mount of Beatitudes, we will never experience the happiness that comes from our daily encounter with God, who is love. In such case we will only pretend to strive for holiness, spreading visions of our own abilities and potential, in the same time envying those who have put their trust in God without reservation, and achieved the heavenly finish of their earthly journey.

The People of the Beatitudes give a clear testimony that Jesus is risen, that He lives, and they bear witness to this with the consistency of their lives with the message of the Gospel and the promptings of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of God extends an invitation to each of us: Not to pretend to be a saint, but to be holy. Be holy - that is, to live in intimacy with God, because Holy Wins. Wins with the strength of Christ - the Conqueror. Our greatest success is our hope in Him and our persistent pursuit of the kingdom prepared for us from the foundation of the world.

Be interested in Heaven, and not in what people say and think about you. Only this will make you truly happy, truly Blessed.
