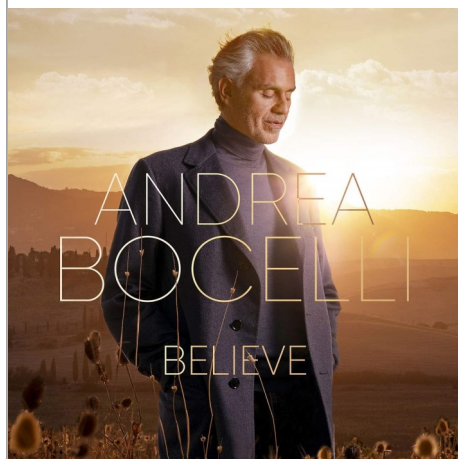

Fr. Tomas's Weekly Reflection

Is your life about multiplying your talents or burying them down? To bury is to keep them only for yourself, not to give back to God and not to serve people with them, to have them only for your own use and satisfaction. The burden of the gift, however, can be too difficult to carry. Sometimes so much, that it's easier to hide it not only for oneself, but even from oneself. After all, in Jesus' times, one talent was an equivalent of between 40 and 120 pounds of weight.

In the modern times the word talent has acquired a different meaning - it is understood as a natural aptitude or skill. In the parable we hear today, Jesus does not refer, however, to the specific so-called natural, human talents, but rather wants us to know that each and every gift from God is a call and an invitation to work on improving ourselves, on growing and benefitting others as well.

The behavior of the lazy servant, a man who does not ensure that the gifts received are multiplied and bear fruit, may seem familiar to us. It points out to the distinction that each one of us has to make - between the legitimate and good fear of the Lord and the false human fear. The false one is based on a calculation and distrust towards God, while the fear of the Lord is not a dread nor terror, but as a gift of the Holy Spirit, it inspires us to do our best not to offend God.

To every one of us God has granted certain talents. He distributed these gifts among us according to His will and knowledge of each one of us. One may think the distribution was unfair, because the gifts vary, but the reality is that everyone received as much as is needed for their salvation. It doesn't matter if you got a lot or a little, but it is important to use what you got properly. The problem arises when we do not know how to use them, how to develop them, how to live with them.

Sometimes our talents need to be developed through work, like polishing a diamond, but other times they just come out on their own, and it is only up to us whether we use them correctly or bury them in a deep, well hidden, also from ourselves, hiding place.

God requires that what He has given to each of us be spent in the service of Him and our neighbor. Whoever has received more should give more - even though it requires more effort, the reward will be proportionately greater. Let us therefore not be jealous of the others' talents, but rather let us take care of our own development, not only in a natural, biological sense, but also and perhaps above all, intellectual and spiritual growth, so that through our lives we may participate in God's creative work, that we multiply the gifts received from Him, and understand what they are given us for.
