# Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

We attempt various preparations in many different situations. Sometimes our preparation transforms us completely, from ground up. However, it is always an activity related to waiting for someone, for something, for a unique moment. Sometimes this transformation takes place not only in ourselves, but also in our environment, where the changes that occur are so dramatic that nothing is the same anymore. The Church reminds us and encourage us not to forget, in the turmoil of our daily duties, to prepare ourselves well for the final encounter with the Lord. However, to understand and accept this, we have to complete a long journey here on earth.

We need wisdom first, just as we read in today's first reading. It fits perfectly with this time of preparation. Wisdom is for those who seek it. As a Gift from God, it serves us to recognize the truths and mysteries awaiting us, as well as it helps us to fall in love with them. For resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her. She hastens to make herself known in anticipation of their desire; Whoever watches for her at dawn shall not be disappointed, for he shall find her sitting by his gate.

By searching for wisdom and filling ourselves with it, we gain the joy of getting to know the Word of God. Like in the communicating vessels: because we come to know God's Word through wisdom, we gain hope without which there is no joy in knowing faith and living in Jesus Christ. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep. Therefore, we need not to be afraid of death, as long as we are willing to learn how to live our lives well here on earth. Our goal should be the eternity where real life begins, and this real life is gained by faith.

The transition to eternal life requires good preparation, and our life here and now gives us this opportunity. In the Gospel message we hear what is important in this period of preparation and expectation. If we listen carefully, we will understand how to be prudent, vigilant, persistent, ready to go out to meet Christ. A well-spent "today" will prepare us for good "tomorrow". The lamp lit in the darkness symbolizes human life, lit by our hearts, illuminated by faith and hope and burning with the oil of love, which the Holy Spirit pours into our hearts. The light of the lamp is the Sanctifying Grace, representing the state of the human soul. Let us therefore be wise through our faith. Let us go towards the goal of life with our heads held high, because our lamps lit up can brighten not only our lives, but also the lives of other people. Christ's exhortation in the last sentence of the Gospel is valid for all of us at any time of our lives: stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour.
