Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

A very young girl, pretty much still a child, who as an infant was offered by her parents to God, lived her entire life according to the laws of God and His commandments, just got engaged, and obedient to her future husband wants to live according to the traditions of her religion. Then suddenly she finds out about God's desire for her, the role He has prepared for her.

In accordance with the Jewish tradition, she was offered to God in the Temple, and later engaged to Joseph - a descendant of King David, and therefore from the lineage close to God, connected with the royal family. Her life looked promising, her future was bright, it was to be a life like many other couples, calm, harmonious and pious. But God's plans for her were different, she was to become the one who would crush the head of the serpent, who would become the Mother of the Son of God, and consequently of all of us.

Archangel Gabriel announced to her the unfathomable message; from the moment of her *Fiat*, she was under special care and protection of God, and with her response she subjected her life to the will of the Most High, who chose her to be the mother of the Holy One, called the Son of God. She wasn't prepared for that, she didn't expect that, in her simplicity and piety she couldn't have even dreamed about it.

We have to realize that the foundation for what we hear in today's Gospel is the plan that God had for Mary. God's plan that is the consequence of His love for people: He chose Mary because He needed His Son to become one of us, to save us through the Incarnation, Death and Resurrection.

Let us therefore consider whether we are trusting God completely like Mary, in order to experience His protection, presence and - most importantly - Love.
