Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

One of the principles of Newtonian dynamics states that an object at rest stays at rest and an object in motion stays in motion with the same speed and in the same direction unless acted upon by an unbalanced force. If we applied this principle to the dynamics of human life, and especially to its moral aspect, we could say that if human behavior is not determined by any higher values or is influenced equally by good and evil, human life only mindlessly "goes on". If we also take into account the fact that from the very beginning human nature is contaminated by original sin, this "going on" is rather "going down" into the mire of evil, iniquity and sin, of which Nineveh became the biblical symbol.

But Nineveh has also become a biblical symbol of conversion. This was made possible by the fact that at some point a new, additional, unbalanced force began to act upon this "object going down". This force was the word of the prophet Jonah, which was in fact a proclamation of the word of God. And the people of Nineveh believed God, repented and turned away from their wrongdoings. The story of Nineveh, which was falling towards destruction, changed its course. A conversion saved it from a moral collapse and allowed it to be spared.

When the time of fulfillment has come, God gave the grace of conversion to all peoples and nations. The words of Jesus Christ, the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel, began to affect people whose life was slipping towards sin or just "going on", in the mundane, small stability.

The power of the Savior's words is amazing. Those whose hearts were focused on the nets, at his calling *abandoned their nets and followed him*. Simon and Andrew understood that to be fishers of men meant more than just fishing. Stepping away from the nets meant moving further on the road to perfection. After all, the human person is more important than anything else, but it is not yet the highest value, and that's why James and John *left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him*.

To leave does not have to mean to stop loving or caring. To leave can mean to break away in order return better and stronger. It is not about a detachment to free oneself from burdens and responsibilities, to make life more comfortable, neither it is about an abandonment of the obligations that flow from interpersonal bonds. Breaking away from the world and people makes sense only when it hurts, when it is a sacrifice, when it is a testimony to conversion, that is, turning to the highest of values. Essentially, it means keeping the necessary distance from anything that might distract us from our primary and ultimate goal: salvation of souls and the building of the kingdom of God here on earth.
