Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Among the many criteria of the mature personality, one of the most important is the inner freedom. If one experiences it, they can maintain their own point of view and defend their position, even under a severe external pressure. Internal freedom is about being faithful to one's own convictions, even if some group of people have completely different beliefs. On the other hand, lack of freedom can become a source of sadness, anxiety, dissatisfaction and frustration, stemming From internal limitations or simply an enslavement.

Today's Gospel draws our attention to the reality of freedom. Jesus in the synagogue in Capernaum liberates the man possessed by an unclean spirit. This scene reminds us that only the Lord has the power to free us from everything that binds us, and that He is the source of true freedom. Those who experience the liberation through the power of God realize that to be truly free is to be able to act, without reservation, according to one's conscience, the inner voice that tells the right from the wrong. Jesus demonstrates this freedom by acting in accordance with what He preached throughout his life. He is free to the point that for His courage and for the Truth He preaches, is willing to pay the highest price. This prompts a question regarding our freedom. Are we willing to live our lives according to what we believe in? Are we courageous in defending the Truth? Because of there is any doubt in answering those questions, it means that we're not fully free yet, but rather there's something still limiting us, fear, embarrassment, false perception of kindness or political correctness.

One of the essential strategies in keeping the inner freedom is remaining in God's Sanctifying Grace: for whoever lives under the protection of Grace is protected by God himself. The Sacraments the Church administers, according to Jesus' will, are the source of the life-giving Grace. Systematic confession and reception of the Eucharist cannot be stressed enough. Christians should live by this one principle: to defend the life of God's Grace in oneself. Although the Evil One will try, he will not overcome the inner stronghold that Sanctifying Grace creates in us. In order to preserve this stronghold intact, besides the frequent use of the Sacraments, we need to prevent from letting anything that might pose a danger of enslavement to enter our home: things like magic, fortune tellers, card reading, tarot, occult, cannot have any place in our lives.

Above all, we are called to live our lives according to the voice of our conscience, which is constantly strengthened by the message of the Gospel. The life experienced in inner freedom is a life of goodness, justice, mercy, and truth. This constant effort to work on deepening our freedom determines our humanity, where freedom is a sign of being created in God's image and likeness. Ultimately, it is us who decide about our freedom. After all, freedom is an internal state of soul, mind and heart, lived out in the world. If we don't give up on freedom ourselves, no one can take it away from us.


