LENTEN DISCIPLINE

OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18-59 are required to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Cleanliness can bring satisfaction and even delight or happiness. We clean our houses, because we feel good in a clean environment. We vacuum, dust off furniture, clean shoes, and wash clothes. Taking a shower gives a pleasant satisfaction. On the other hand, a dirty, sweaty body makes us uncomfortable; we cannot imagine eating dinner on plates that have not been washed. It would be disgusting to use silverware with remnants from a previous meal.

What do we do on a spiritual level though? Do we take time to purify our thoughts, feelings, and most of all, our soul? Our sin causes us to look at ourselves with self-loathing. Isn't pure heart more important than a clean shirt or lack of dirt under our fingernails? Isn't a chaste look at another person, devoid of desire or contempt, more important than the clean windows before Christmas? Cleanliness is necessary, not only in our environment, but also in a person. Unclean thoughts and unclean motives, dishonest behavior, suspicious activities, all these come from something even more rotten within ourselves.

Where does all the "unclean" actions in our conduct come from? They have their source in the overemphasized focus on oneself. A leper is a person suffering from a nasty bodily disease, but even more so, one who looks at himself in disgust. Leprosy can affect us even if our bodies are not covered with rotting scabs. Self-disgust can be the result of many years of focus on appearance, position in the community, sexual attractiveness, every word and gesture. This cleanliness is what St. Paul points out to when he writes that his concern is *not seeking his own benefit but that of the many, that they may be saved*.

The description of a leper in the Book of Leviticus, if we read between the lines, contains a hidden message. A person wandering around, with disheveled hair, covered face, with body suffering with sores or scabs, and shouting "unclean!", could not go unnoticed. Everyone was paying attention to someone like that, everyone was taking notice, and this is probably the "leprous" approach to life. One who is unclean wants to draw attention to himself at all costs. That's why so much dirt and ugliness comes at us through TV, social media, music. This is where the desire for "likes", "thumbs up", "follows" and the like comes from. The unclean demand the attention of others, that's why they are so loud and so obnoxious.

Jesus, on the other hand, did not want to be the center of attention. He was not basking in human worship, while the leper made a show even of his own healing. Not only did Jesus strictly forbid him to spread the news, because he didn't want an unnecessary attention, but also because he wanted to heal the leper from his spiritual illness: his sick need to attract attention. This shows that it is easier to heal someone of the leprosy of the body than of their leprous desires.
