Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

If we were to reflect on the condition of the faith of modern Catholics, we would probably come to the conclusion that they are actually maybe only 25-30% Catholic, and the rest of their beliefs not accurately representing Catholic faith, or sometimes even openly contrary to teachings of the Catholic Church. It happens because the requirements of faith become for contemporary men too difficult, demands too challenging, expectations too high. Meanwhile, in the pursuit of happiness in everyday life, the path of least resistance, even when it comes to faith, is promoted as the way to go.

It's shocking, but it also makes us question if it is still faith or already a heresy, a departure from faith. It's the easiest to analyze it studying our religious practices and their motivation. We go to confession once a year, because it is required by the Catechism. We celebrate Mass every Sunday because Church obliges us to do so. We observe holidays and celebrations out of routine. Where in all of that is our faith? And where is our dedication to God? We need to realize that the satisfaction of our hunger for happiness can only be achieved in the closest relationship with God.

Listening to today's readings about Abraham, who is asked by God to sacrifice his only son, most of us experience mixed feelings, because we have deviated so far from understanding God's love, that we are unable to understand His pedagogy. Our God, who is love, trusts us and in us, but also requires us to trust Him and in Him. He pushes Abraham to his limits, but ultimately never allows him to cross the line. He does that to establish a covenant with mankind, which is fulfilled in His Son. Thanks to Jesus' saving death, we will be able to achieve happiness, but it is not a happiness in a temporary life, but eternal happiness. But the necessary condition is for us to face the challenges God sets before us, rather than run away from them

On the Mount of Transfiguration, Peter had the opportunity to truly experience this happiness that comes from God, when he exclaimed *Rabbi*, *it is good that we are here!* The Transfiguration of the Lord reminds us that there is a completely different reality beyond this world and its problems, which we long for. We can come closer to this other reality only by listening to the God's voice and following His commands. Challenging ourselves - if we dare to do it - will bring positive changes, that will allow us to grow in faith and see things that many others do not see. The foundation of that challenge has to be anchored in the trust in God, just like Abraham trusted.
