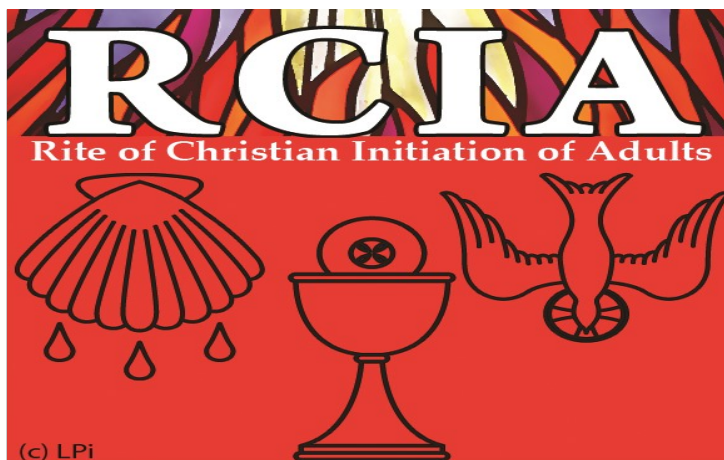
Fr. Tomas's Weekly Reflection

Usually, the story of the cleansing of the temple is interpreted as a symbol of cleansing our conscience of the idolatry of greed. If we go deeper we will realize that Jesus encourages us to look into ourselves and see what our lives are made of; because we might find there our fears, ambitions, greed, lust and pride. If the structure of our life is made of those elements, the building itself is unhealthy to live in; it can easily develop mold of sin and get to the point when everything needs to be torn down. The temptation is to defend the way my life is structured, yet I'm unhappy in it. That's a clear indication something has to be torn down in order for the rebuild to take place.

The question we need to ask ourselves is whether we allow Christ to tear down and banish our inner world. Do we allow Him to destroy in us our narcissistic views, that we are owed everything and that we should be served, that everything should be according to our plans and desires? Too often we complain that our lives are falling apart, are not going the way we expected, our ideas are not being realized. But if our existence is falling into pieces, it is only because it has a rotten foundation. If your life is in turmoil, that's good, because you can finally hand over the construction site to the Carpenter's Son.

It will be painful when that happens, but Jesus will do it in order to examine our misperceptions. Maybe we have believed that love is about constantly forcing others to idolize us and reassure us that we are the most wonderful in the world? Maybe we care more about other people's opinions than what God thinks about us? Maybe we were told that we have to follow our hearts, and that has trapped us in hatred, lust or jealousy? And isn't our false humility just a cover for our inability to make decisions and dependence on others? Is our idea of a family life even close to the message of the Gospel, or maybe it has much more in common with a neurotic will to subjugate your children and spouse? Isn't our sense of decency really only a concern for external appearances? Or maybe our prayers are simply a set of commands we throw at God? Aren't we confusing the idea of good with whatever feels good?

It's a simple temptation we fall for quite easily: to think that we are exceptionally good, better than everyone else, or at least better than many others. The image we have of ourselves must collapse, however, because it is not the truth, but a smoke screen behind which fear, self-hatred and helplessness reside. There are many questions that should cause the building of our life to crack, and collapse, pressed by truth. There are even more answers that give us countless opportunities to begin the rebuild. The new edifice of existence is to be built on the Word of God and on His commandments. The building founded on those will never collapse.



THE SCRUTINIES

In the next three weeks we will be celebrating the scrutinies. The purpose of each of the scrutinies is “to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect” and “to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, holy, and good”. “The scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ.” At its core, the scrutinies are not about the sinfulness of the elect but about the overwhelming grace of God in Christ.
