Fr. Tomosz's Weekly Reflection

The situation from today's Gospel, where the Greeks came to the Apostles and asked to get introduced to Jesus, poses a question: why didn't they come to Jesus directly, but wanted to get to know Him through the intercession of the Disciples?

When we travel to another country, on a pilgrimage, we usually benefit from the services of a guide. Their knowledge allows us to understand the history of the country and the significance of its various locations and monuments. Even if the guide does an excellent job, it's easy to conclude that one would need to live in a given country to get to know and understand it well. It is rather similar with our spiritual life and the knowledge of God. Exploring God's greatness with a help of a guide doesn't even scratch the surface, and the best way to truly know Him is to dwell in Him.

It is necessary to find our home in God, to settle in Him, in order to discover within Him the treasures of Life and Wisdom. And it is not enough to get to know Him only from the outside, similarly to the way we get to know a point of interest on a map. On the journey to God's dwelling place we need good guides. This is why Jesus instituted His Church, with Apostles and their successors, with presbyters and deacons, who living their lives in a deep knowledge of Christ, nourished by prayer and meditation on His word, should become spiritual guides, leading the pilgrims to a deeper intimacy with God.

Jeremiah, in the passage we read today, wrote that at the time of the coming of the Messiah, God will be the closest to man, even tangibly familiar, so that no one will go astray, looking for the truth in human wisdom instead. When Philip stood before Andrew, announcing to him the desire of the Greeks, they both knew that, at that very moment, the modern world represented by the Greek philosophy, was confronted with the opportunity of knowing God directly. They recognized that Jesus is the best guide over the dwelling place of God, because while still human, He is God! We cannot learn more about God than what we can learn from God himself.

What is our knowledge of Jesus like? Is it enough for us just to know and believe that God exists? Do we believe in Jesus because it is a tradition of our family, or because we have recognized Him as our Lord and set out on a journey to get to know Him? These Greeks were not tourists who, out of curiosity, wanted to see some miracle worker. They wanted to go deep into the mystery of Jesus' life and remain in it.







SPIRITUAL ADOPTION

Spiritual Adoption is an initiative based on an idea by Archbishop Fulton Sheen in which participants pray for a specific, but unknown, unborn child for nine months and learn about fetal development during the pregnancy. Traditionally the prayer begins on the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, March 25th, and lasts until Christmas, to celebrate 9 months of Blessed Mother's pregnancy.

The logo of Spiritual Adoption replaces the stork that everyone knows safely delivers babies, with a dove - the symbol of the Holy Spirit, which represents the love and prayers of participants that peacefully deliver both unborn children and their parents.

What are the requirements of Spiritual Adoption?

Participants in the Spiritual Adoption pledge to pray for nine months for an unborn baby. Since the child is adopted spiritually, it is not necessary to identify an actual unborn child. At the end of the nine months of prayer, together with the celebration of Christmas, all who prayed give God thanks for His great gift of Life.

The Spiritual Adoption Program has three goals:

- Encourage prayer for parents who are expecting a child, that they will respond to God's grace and welcome their child into life.
- Educate adults and children about the development of the unborn child.
- Provide for mothers in need and celebrate Life and its Giver at the conclusion of the program.

How can you participate in the Spiritual Adoption?

To help accomplish the goal of Spiritual Adoption, everyone who pledges their spiritual support pray the following daily prayer for a period of nine months, and offer their additional personal daily commitment, i.e. the decade of the Rosary for the intention of the unborn child and their parents. Throughout the nine months period we will be publishing in our bulletin a regular update on the development of the unborn child, to help us understand the process through which God forms every human life in a mother's womb.
