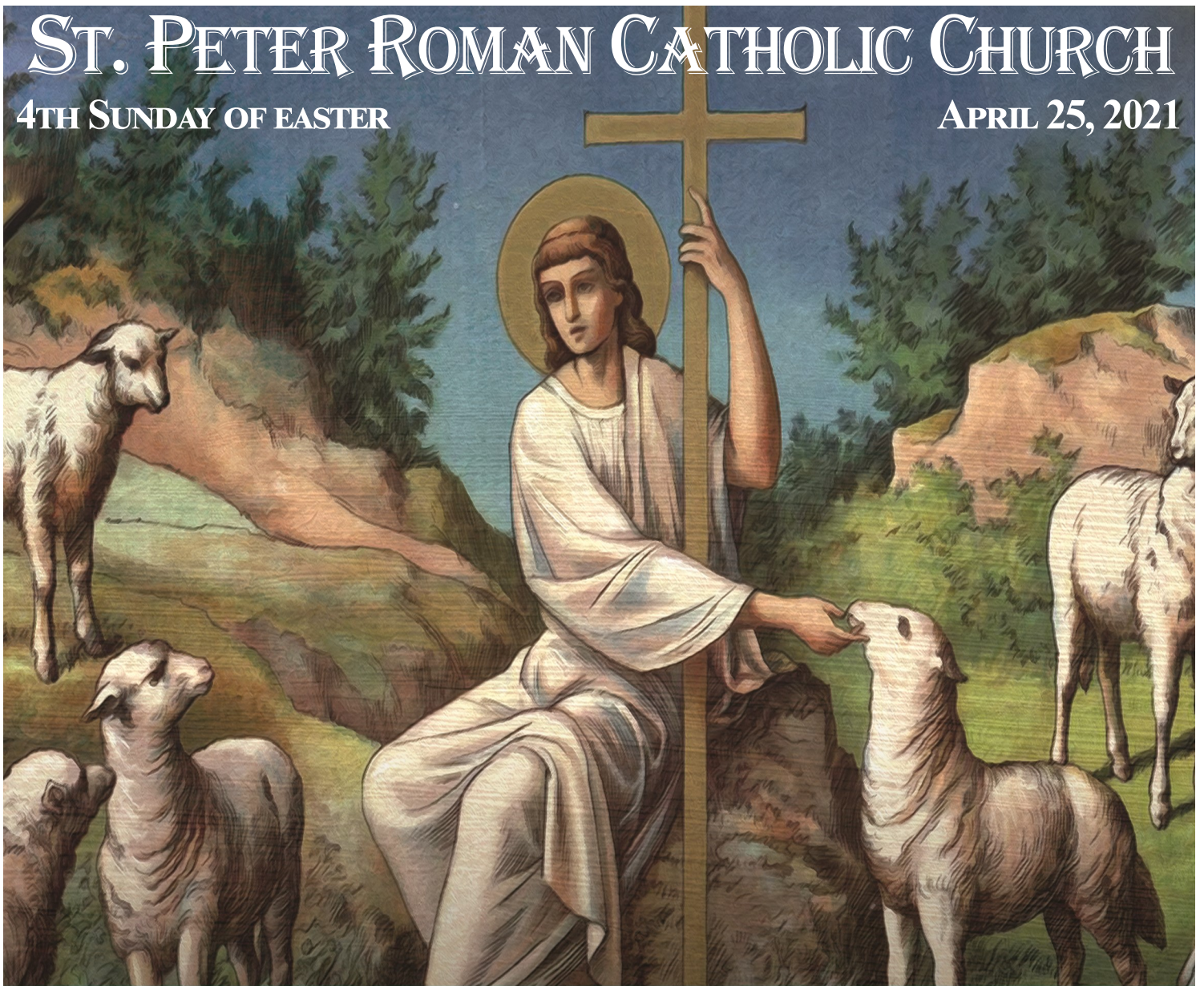

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday. It begins the week of prayer for priestly and religious vocations. In today's liturgy Jesus, the Son of God, introduces himself as the Good Shepherd, who looks after his flock. He does this with the authority given to him from the Father, with whom He is one. Jesus rejects the possibility of a political interpretation of his mission and proclaims the Kingdom of God based on the commandment of love, rooted in the faith in God who is Love himself. He invites to his kingdom everyone who wishes to fulfill his Father's will, expressed predominantly in the teaching of the Gospel.

The mission of the Good Shepherd is to be continued on earth by the ordained priests. In the Tradition of the Catholic Church we distinguish between the common priesthood, in which all the baptized participate, and the ministerial priesthood, also known as sacramental priesthood, which is administered through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The common priesthood enables and obliges the faithful to participate in God's worship. The ministerial priesthood, on the other hand, conveys a sacred power by which priests serve the people of God through teaching, worship and pastoral care. The ministerial priesthood was instituted for the people of God, who need salvation.

As representatives of Christ the Good Shepherd, priests again and again, by celebrating the Eucharist, make present Jesus' saving sacrifice. *Those who minister at the altar share in the sacrificial offerings* and thus they fulfill the Master's will: *Do this in memory of me.*

Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel, which is a sign of my opposition to evil, sin, injustice, and error. It brings hope to the poor, but it also is a warning sign to all those who consider themselves "good enough" and not in need of conversion.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Stewards of the Church

Stewards of God's gifts are not passive beneficiaries. We cooperate with God in our own redemption and in the redemption of others. We are also obliged to be stewards of the Church—collaborators and cooperators in continuing the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, which is the Church's essential mission. This mission—proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying—is our task. It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the Church. All members of the Church have their own roles to play in carrying out its mission:

- Parents, who nurture their children in the light of faith;
- Parishioners, who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community;
- All Catholics, who give generous support—time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocesan programs and to the universal Church.

Obstacles to Stewardship

People who want to live as Christian disciples and Christian stewards face serious obstacles. In the United States and other nations, a dominant secular culture often contradicts religious convictions about the meaning of life. This culture frequently encourages us to focus on ourselves and our pleasures.

At times, we can find it far too easy to ignore spiritual realities and to deny religion a role in shaping human and social values. As Catholics who have entered into the mainstream of American society and experienced its advantages, many of us also have been adversely influenced by this secular culture. We know what it is to struggle against selfishness and greed, and we realize that it is harder for many today to accept the challenge of being a Christian steward. It is essential, therefore, that we make a special effort to understand the true meaning of stewardship and live accordingly. (US Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship)
