

Fr. Tomosz's Weekly Reflection

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you, says Jesus. This promise seems incredible, improbable, impossible. Ask for whatever? Anything? So many requests remain unanswered and expectations unfulfilled. And I'm told to ask for anything?

Note, however, that Jesus makes the condition: *If you remain in me.* And this condition is not easy to abide by. To remain in Jesus is to be like a branch growing out of a vine. Its very existence depends on being connected to the life-giving stem. But from the beginning of the world man does not want to be like a branch. He wants to be independent in existence and in action. He wants to achieve great things and owe it to no one but himself. Meanwhile, Jesus reminds us that one needs to be like a branch, be first invested totally into the relationship with Him, before asking for *whatever you want.* The prospect is great, but it's really hard to give up everything in order to gain everything.

But why is it so hard? One of the reasons is indicated by St. John in today's second reading: *Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.* This encouragement stems from the observation of our world, where it is so easy to make verbal declarations, and way more difficult to follow them up with the deeds, actions, attitude, life.

John identifies this "remaining in Christ" with love. After all, love is the sacrifice of giving up everything for the sake of the other. In our culture the most common and popular theme, in writing, music, cinema, is indeed love, but not the love John talks about, but love-feeling, love that desires to possess, to have and to enjoy someone else. Obviously, this is not what Jesus wants and what the Apostle calls *deed and truth*. What is expected is that *we should believe in the name of God's Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us*.

And He loved us in giving everything – giving all of himself, even to the madness of the cross. All for all. If you give everything out of love for God and people, then through the real, sacrificial love you remain in Jesus – just like a branch remains in a vine. Only then can you *ask for whatever you want, it will be done for you*.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER <u>Bearing Fruit</u>

In today's Gospel reading on "the vine and the branches," Jesus offers a quintessential stewardship statement: "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." The theme of this reading is "fruitfulness." We hear the expression "bear fruit" five times. And "bearing fruit" is not something that the branches can do by themselves. They are extensions of the vine, Jesus, and are pruned by the gardener, God the Father, who wants them to be fruitful and to be drawn into the unity of the Father and Son. Good stewards recognize that God's love, presence, gardening and pruning are gifts. Do our lives reflect a capacity to be fruitful? Do we believe that by hearing the Word of the Lord and responding, we not only produce "good fruit," but abide in the very life of God?
