Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

On the day of Pentecost, after over a year of pandemic, like the Apostles in the Upper Room we are back *all in one place together*, and with the eyes of faith we see the scene from the Acts of the Apostles, when *there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.*

Here's something that for the last year had not been heard of, something that eye has not seen, ear has not heard. And all this thanks to the power of Jesus. From this day on our lives, like the lives of the apostles, change radically: there is no place for fear, distrust, uncertainty, but there is hope, courage, and clarity. From this day on the Paraclete will continue to testify on behalf of Jesus and will strengthen our waning faith, so that we too can bear witness to Him in the world. The Spirit will also *guide us to all truth*, he will continue to reveal to us the message of the Gospel.

We may be confused, like the apostles in the Upper Room, maybe we are ashamed of our lack of faith, maybe we are unable to communicate with the one who does not speak our language. Therefore, each of us has a need for our own Pentecost, our own outpouring of the Holy Spirit, an encounter with renewing and transforming power of God. He is the life-giving force of the Church. We are reminded that the Holy Spirit is indispensable in Christian life: without him, we are spiritually dead. Whatever happens in our life of faith, it is done precisely by the power of the Holy Spirit. Every authentic prayer, sacramental act, sincere profession of faith, repentance over sin, outburst of supernatural joy, attentive listening to the Word of God, inspiration to do good - all these are the work of the Holy Spirit.

Many believers, unfortunately, forget about the need of the Holy Spirit, living in a spiritual poverty. They may pray with words, but not their hearts; they are afraid to go inside the Upper Room of their parish church; they experience constant fear and guilt over their sins; on the occasion of a funeral or wedding, they "receive Communion", they refuse to be catechized, and the Word of God written in the Scriptures is barely known to them.

With the pandemic, lockdowns, lack of publicly available Mass, difficulty in receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, separation from the actual Bread of Life and relying on the Spiritual Communion we were forced last year to a similar experience, and more than ever we realize that this is not a life of faith, but a spiritual vegetation.

Now, since from today we gather again in our parish Upper Room, with the help of the gifts of the Holy Spirit given to us, we need to become brave witnesses of Christ and His Gospel in the world. Today, full of trust, we want to pray earnestly for a new outpouring of the Spirit on us, on our families, on the whole world, so that we may begin to live according to the Spirit and be truly free.
