



Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Many of us have experienced the visit of mysterious guests who, knocking on our door, wanted to talk about God, holding the Bible under in their hands. Yes, I'm talking about Jehovah's Witnesses. Personally, I think their visit is an accusation of our indolence and neglect of two basic Christian responsibilities: knowing God in the Bible and evangelizing. I'm missing the days when in the Seminary we were debating about whether Jesus Christ was consubstantial (Greek: homousios) with the Father, or merely similar (Greek: homoiousios) to Him. Many Christians today would be surprised such debate ever existed, and probably wouldn't be even able to explain what consubstantial means.

Today's passage from the Gospel of Matthew is a great testimony of the belief the early Christian Community had regarding the Holy Trinity. Reading it we can sense the understanding of the difference between and at the same time equality of the Divine Persons. No one is equal to God except Him in other persons. The Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are certainly distinguishable, as in the original manuscripts their Names are inscribed in the same verse. And if we pay attention we will see that the Baptism is to be administered in the Name, not in names. One Name, that is, one God, but at the same time Three on the same level. The entire Trinity performs an action that belongs only to God. Baptism, which is the work of the Trinity, frees us from sins, sanctifies us, makes us children of God, and these activities are the work of God alone.

Several times Jesus was accused of blaspheming, but every single time it was because He was making himself equal with God. And an interesting thing is that Jesus never denied. He really made himself equal to God by calling God his Father. If He has made himself equal with God, He is either God or a blasphemer. Jesus was crucified because he never denied being God, especially at the judgment of Caiaphas.

Similarly, the Holy Spirit never appears as some sort of "Soul of the Father" or a "Spirit of the Son", or as an impersonal power, but always as an independent Person. Yet He is the same God as the Father and the Son.

Theology says that the Father does not come from anyone, He does not have a beginning; the Son comes from the Father through true begetting, and the Spirit from both the Father and the Son. We do not have to be outstanding experts in the Church's dogmas, but knowing the Trinity is necessary for us to not only close the door to the False Witnesses, but also to close their mouths, so that they do not falsify the truth.
