Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The Church commemorates the institution of the Blessed Sacrament properly on Holy Thursday, when she recognized the Eucharist as a memorial of the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and his salvific sacrifice for us. The solemnity of Corpus Christi, or more accurately the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, distinguishes the Eucharist as a heavenly banquet and a permanent presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Since the 13th century, the Church has been celebrating a separate feast of Corpus Christi to give thanks to God for this extraordinary gift in a most solemn way.

Tradition recognizes Saint Juliana of Liège as the promoter of the Solemnity, first celebrated in Liège in 1246, and later adopted for the Catholic Church in 1264. In her visions Jesus requested from her the institution of a separate feast in honor of the Most Holy Eucharist. She was even given a day for the celebration: Thursday after Holy Trinity Sunday. In 1246, the first Eucharistic procession took place, and in 1264 the Solemnity of Corpus Christi was introduced in Rome by Pope Urban IV.

Today's Gospel passage reminds us of the Last Supper when Jesus gave His Body and Blood to His disciples. Our Savior is the Living Bread, who comes to people to satisfy their hunger for love, hunger for truth, hunger for brotherhood, hunger for victory over sin and death. This reality of Jesus' real presence in the Sacrament of the Eucharist obliges us to receive Holy Communion frequently, worthily, and with dignity.

We use the word Communion to identify the Blessed Sacrament, because it unites us both with Christ and with our brothers and sisters. The bread we break is a participation in the Body of Christ. Since there is one bread, we who are many are one body. For we all take from the same bread. Christ is one. His body is also one. Therefore, the main earthly effect of a worthy participation in the Breaking of Bread is the unity of the followers of Christ. On the other hand, lack of recognition of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist leads to a division and a distortion of Jesus' intention for his followers to be one. Because the Eucharist is not just another rite, but a personification of God's love for us.

Today, when we come to confess our faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, it is worth asking ourselves a few questions: do I believe in the presence of Christ under the appearances of Bread and Wine? What is my relationship with Jesus? How often do I feed myself with Communion, the food of pilgrims, on the way towards immortality? Do I receive Communion worthily? After all, the quality of our relationships – not only with God but also with our neighbors – depends on the way we participate in the Eucharist. It is in the Eucharist that Christ fulfills his Paschal promise: I am with you always, until the end of the age. Knowing this, we need to recognize Jesus' living presence and experience the Eucharist as a personal encounter with him.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

The New Covenant

Today's Gospel gives St. Mark's account of Jesus gathering his disciples for a last supper, revealing to them a new covenant established through his own blood that would be poured out as a sacrifice for them. Every time we participate in the Eucharist, we make a pledge to renew and deepen our participation in Christ's covenant in practical ways. For those who exercise stewardship of Christ's covenant, that means making daily, personal sacrifices to strengthen this covenant relationship such as deepening our relationship with the Lord in prayer, supporting our parish, and giving comfort to the poor and those who suffer. As we begin to see our way out of the COVID pandemic, it is a good time to reflect on how we might renew and strengthen our covenant with the Lord and our community in practical ways.
