Fr. Tomosz's Weekly Reflection

Everything we read from the Scripture during Sunday Masses is to help us understand what God wanted us to hear from Him. Jesus uses parables to convey God's message to both his contemporaries and future generations-to us. We are God's children, so the words of the parables often sound as if they were directed at children. But the greatest advantage of teaching in parables is that they are still as relevant today as they were 2000 years ago.

God's power and His authority are the themes of today's readings. God can exalt everyone who is humble and humiliate everyone who is confident: all the trees of the field shall know that I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom. As I, the LORD, have spoken, so will I do. It is interesting to see that Prophet Ezekiel, who lived centuries before the birth of Christ, also uses parables to illustrate his point. It is the Holy Spirit who inspires the writers of the Scripture in the same way, who directs these words not only to his generation, but also to us, to those who hear them here and now. And the message is simple: in the light of God's authority, to grow in the Him with love and humility, without any exaltation over others.

This existence in humility under the authority of God is what Kingdom of God is all about. Jesus, knowing our limitations, tries to explain the very essence of God's Kingdom, and again, in the parable, He gives us instructions on how to live our lives. It is because the Kingdom of God is not a place but a way of life, because our growth in faith depends on how we will live it, how we will nourish it. The Kingdom of God is living our lives according to God's will, in preparation for the ultimate encounter with God, face to face, at the final judgment.

Under the authority of God we are to live like that mustard seed which *once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade.* Our faith is fertile ground on which our life is to thrive, and at the same time our life is fertile ground on which our faith is to grow.
