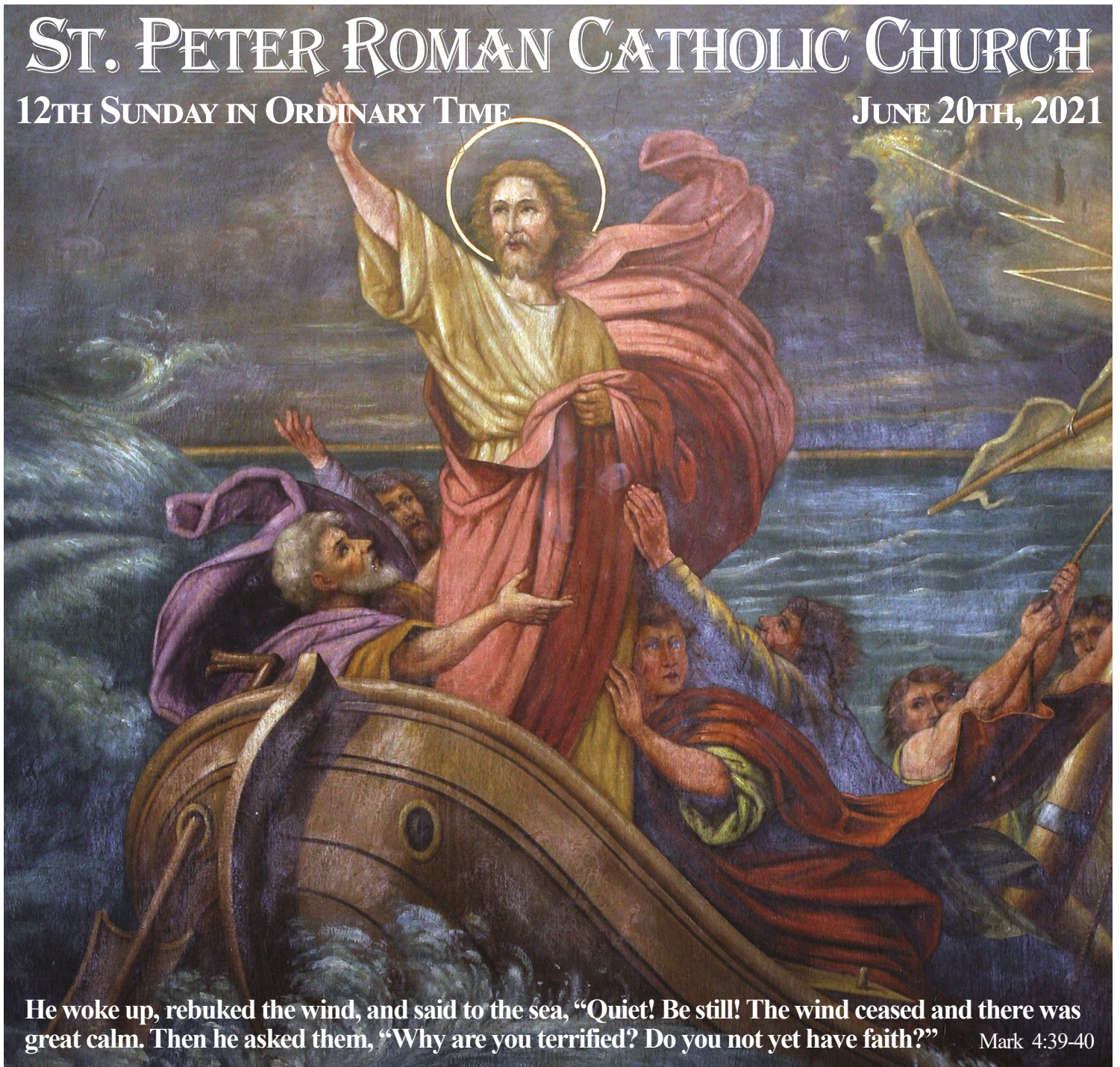

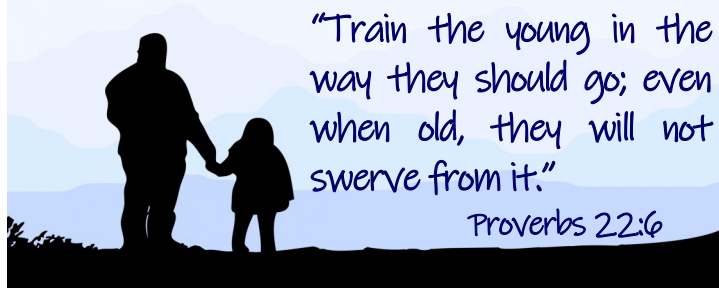

Fr. Thomas's Weekly Reflection

God does not promise us a life without storms, but He does promise us that He will always be with us in our storms. The storm that happened to the disciples on the lake allowed them to discover even deeper the mystery of Jesus. It became an opportunity for them to realize who He really is. Nothing helps us discover the presence and power of God more than critical, challenging situations. On the one hand, we experience great fear, on the other – we never feel so close to God in any other circumstances.

The experience from today's Gospel passage allowed the disciples to rediscover Jesus. Sluggishness in spiritual life is a great danger to human existence, because can make us forget that God is with us. Jesus was in the stern. In the Greek text, this place was called *Prymna*, meaning the place for the one in charge. *Prymnetes* is the helmsman or manager, as well as the ruler. Jesus was in a place from which everything should be controlled, but the disciples allowed Him to fall asleep. They have allowed the situation when the person who should be in charge is taken out of the equation. This is a metaphor of our spiritual life when Jesus is there, but He is not allowed to take the leading role.

Let's translate this story to our world, where great tsunamis, huge fires and hurricanes take place, destroying everything in their path. How about the year 2020 with everything that happened to the entire human kind? How many of us will allow for a true spiritual awakening in our lives, after these signs? How many ask in such situations: "where was God in all of this?" Only that God was right there, but because of our lack of faith we allowed Him to fall asleep. Only God can calm the elements, and we still believe that we can handle the navigation of this world ourselves. Lack of faith brings about an excess of unreasonable fear.

Let us think about our personal life storms. What did they tell us about the place we have assigned Jesus in the boat of our life? If we live in constant fear and experience storms that destroy everything, maybe we are among those asking where is Jesus in all of this? If we want everything to calm down outside and inside us, we need to awake our conscience and call out to Jesus! Not only keep Him in our lives, but place Him in the center of our attention, enthrone Him and proclaim Him as our King! Because if we continue to keep Him in our spiritual life reduced to the role of a mascot, good luck charm, an amulet, we will become a prey to forces that overwhelm us with their power and we will not be able to cope with them.
