



Fr. Tomaszis Weekly Reflection

Before Jesus arrives at the house of the synagogue official, as He walks in the crowd, a woman who had suffered from a hemorrhage for twelve years touches him. St. Mark to describe her ailment uses a metaphor – what we translate as a hemorrhage is in fact designated by the word *Mastix*, which means whipping, lashing or flogging. When the woman gets healed, Jesus tells her literally to *Go in peace and be cured of her lashes*. Knowing that there is no accidental usage of any word in the Scripture, we might suspect that behind this metaphor there is a non-figurative reason for this woman's suffering.

This might be an indication of some possible experience, potentially an aggression with which this woman was treated at home or in her immediate environment. People experiencing trauma often have the worst opinion of themselves; they whip themselves with guilt. They are ruthless with themselves because they were treated ruthlessly. This woman touched Jesus' garments from behind, as if she did not want to be seen or as if she refused to be looked at. Her behavior might indicate some level of self-aggression. She does not want to be looked at because she perceives herself as dirty or disgusting. It's likely that such attitude comes from the fact that her body was disrespected; it was whipped with words or physically ridiculed or raped.

It is important to note the difference between the scourging and whipping that this woman's illness was labeled as, and the touch she went for. There is also a difference between being touched by someone's word or being hit by it. It doesn't even need to be in a reference to a physical violence this woman experienced; it is enough for someone to go through constantly being screamed at or treated with resentment, insult and dissatisfaction to create a negative opinion about oneself and continue the self-torture. A blow from a whip raises a welt, but a blow from the tongue will break bones. Many have fallen by the edge of the sword, but not as many as by the tongue. (Sirach 28:17–18).

More and more we hear about people who do self-harm. The consensus is that the wounded need care, so some hurt themselves intentionally to receive a substitute for the love and care they have been deprived of from those from whom they should receive it. The hunger for love is a tremendous force.

In this bleeding woman thousands of people could see their own story summarized by her desire to touch Jesus' garments, the desire for the healing touch, the desire to be touched rather than flogged.
