Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

The proclamation of the Good News is always accompanied by opposition. St. Paul complained that a thorn in the flesh was given to him, an angel of Satan, to beat him, as he preached the Gospel. Ezekiel was approached by the people of Jerusalem with an attitude of insolence and resistance. Jesus was badly received in the synagogue in Nazareth because he wasn't speaking in a pleasant tone and about simple matters, but touched the sensitive consciences of his listeners.

Many priests learn what it means to oppose the darkness if they are diligent in preaching the Word of God. It happens when the enemy uses a humiliating temptation, or threatening letters, or phone calls with accusations. Such signs do not accompany those who put their flock to sleep, not only with boring homilies, but more so by the preaching devoid of truth. The truth is hard to proclaim, and even harder to accept. Its reality is the hardest to bear. Unfortunately, churches can be run by those who put the brains to sleep, or those who turn them into museums of religious memorabilia.

Every human being, because of the nature stained by the Original Sin, experiences this internal resistance towards the truth, hiding it behind the grotesque façades. We are avoiding it; we have developed skills of camouflaging and building hideouts. The best concealment for the truth is the external piety that - as we convince ourselves - justifies our dark desires and sins. Woe to the prophets! We are used to hiding the real evil and demonstrating an imitation of good. We have learned not to benefit from Christ's justification, but we justify ourselves. We explain to ourselves that either we are forced to act in a certain way, or that our actions are neutral, or we simply blame others. Sometimes we manage to see a little bit of truth about ourselves when we experience our feelings and emotions acting out: when we fall in love, or when we burst out with hatred. Sometimes suffering also reveals to us that we are not as noble as we consider ourselves to be. It rarely happens that we get fed up with this posturing.

However, whenever the prophetic word, the Word from God, is proclaimed, we experience a sudden revelation of a shocking panorama of our interior life. But then, instead of seeking a way to repent, we set on a hunt for a scapegoat. When Jesus reveals to us that we are false, our first reaction is anger. The shock of truth first affects those who expose our falsehood. But every time when we finally agree with the accusation, we experience a liberating relief.

Life ceases to be wonderful when Jesus is ignored. Life ceases to be bearable when we hate Jesus and His teachings. The number of people walking in the pride parades preaching the falsehood of human sexuality, rampant adultery as a consequence of hypocrisy of love perceived as a pleasure and not a sacrifice, abortion presented as a human right rather than as a human tragedy, and many others. It's difficult to preach the truth, but if we stop, what will happen at the day of judgment? *The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard "delay," but he is patient with us, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. (2 Peter 3: 9). But in order for the repentance to be possible, the truth must be proclaimed at all costs.*
