Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

From the altar we hear the call: "Go in peace." Some impatient, others slightly bored, begin to leave their pews and glance at their watches to check the duration of the liturgical celebration. Perhaps they were waiting for this "Go" like a soldier waiting for a "Dismissed" command. Satisfied with the sense of fulfilled Sunday obligation, they will soon move to their everyday activities, until they "switch back on" their relationship with God.

One of the main reasons for the absence of God in everyday life of Catholics is their lack of presence at the Sunday Eucharist. And those who participate in it often leave the church as if at last released, and not as sent by Christ to the world. The dismissal at the end of Mass is not so much to dissolve the congregation, but rather to send it for a mission, to bear witness to Christ and His Gospel in the world. Jesus often uses the phrase "Go" combined with the command to perform certain tasks: He sends disciples to John the Baptist, after his resurrection he sends women to the disciples and sends his Apostles to all nations. He commands us to follow him and carry the cross, and to follow him as if following the light.

In today's liturgy we hear that Jesus begins to send the twelve, but He first summons them. Anyone who does not allow himself to be first summoned by Jesus cannot go into the world with His message. Personal relationship with Jesus is a necessary condition for being sent. In this bond with Him love grows and faith deepens. This association gives us courage and zeal. In Jesus one becomes convinced that they will go to others in His name, based on His authority and propagating His cause. This was the order of things in the mission of the Twelve, and this is kept in the life of the Church till this day.

The calling of all the followers of Christ stretches between Jesus summoned them and He began to send them out. A Christian must consciously fit their lives between being summoned and being sent. This is the nature of Christianity. This is what the evangelization is all about.

Both of these characteristics have their place in the celebration of the Eucharist. The same Christ invites us to himself and then leads us out on a mission. Hence, the development of the missionary, evangelizing and catechetical work of the Church, will always be founded on the Eucharistic life of believers.
