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Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

Indeed, a man needs not only to sleep, eat, work and repeat, but also needs to rest. Moving away from physical or intellectual engagement, towards the spiritual realm, is what God commanded us regarding the Sabbath, and what Jesus instructs His apostles to do when He sends them alone into the wilderness. But we would be wrong to think that He sent them on a mindless vacation. A deserted place is a place where – without unnecessary obstacles – God reveals himself to us. A desert is a space of spiritual rapprochement with God, as well as getting closer to oneself. Getting closer to God and yourself is extremely useful in building relationships with others. Superficial, thoughtless and unhappy people are those who never spend time in a spiritual desert.

Those who are constantly among people are often the most distant from them. An ability of temporarily distancing ourselves from others, in order to get closer to God and oneself, allows to create deeper bonds. Most people, however, cannot stop, rushing blindly forward. They are afraid to slow down because it may expose them to questions of the purpose of life, the meaning behind their efforts, the moral evaluation of their actions. It may make them realize the contradictions and doubts that are raging within them.

However, nobody is able to succeed in permanently running away from themselves. Eventually, the overactive person will get hit by unresolved problems that cannot be reconciled, integrated and understood without a proper distance. A person "addicted to action" will eventually burn out, leaving only a rubble inside, manifesting itself by insomnia, irritation, emotional chaos, and even a vulnerability to certain diseases.

The commandment to keep Sabbath holy is preceded by the word *remember*. It is not a coincidence. The Sabbath is supposed to be an opportunity for sanctification, but it also allows us to recover our own memory. Loss of memory is a great disability, because memory is a personal history that creates an individual identity. To live without memory is to lose your sense of meaning, to vegetate in chaos without awareness, and ultimately to despair.

Who of us wouldn't want to be happy? Jesus teaches us that it is enough to just rest in God, withdraw for a moment from everything we are engaged in and entrust all worries to Him. Jesus himself preached to the people while He sends his disciples into the wilderness. God can help us with our problems, and He is quite good at it, in fact way better than ourselves! The recipe for happiness is resting in God.
