Tackling Stressors Girls Face Today

Worrying

Is your girl a worrier? Break the cycle of fear by having your girl start a "worry journal." Every day for 10 days, ask her to jot down a worry or fear in her journal. On Day 11, ask her to read her fears aloud and count how many came true. Then wait for the gasp...Chances are, NONE of these fears came true.

Scarcity Mindset

In times of fear, it's natural to resort to a scarcity mindset. We default to self-preservation, rather than trusting in God's abundance. Hear this: there is a time and place for preparing well. But preparing well doesn't mean hoarding. Hoarding time, resources, love—they're all manifestations of a scarcity mindset.

The Gospel of John tells us: "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." Raising your girl to live abundantly means exemplifying trust in God's provision, timing, and calling. You shape the lens through which she views life. So, how will you live abundantly today?

Fr. Tomasz's Weekly Reflection

In many circumstances we experience our earthly lives similarly to a journey through ups and downs, hoping that no matter what, we will make it to the other end; trusting that the distance we still have left, will be covered smoothly and without any unnecessary hiccups. In the same way, we advance on the pilgrimage through our spiritual life, but at least in that aspect we have a clear solution laid down for us, the path unraveled by God, who – becoming man – walked it himself and instructed us to follow in his footsteps.

The way of the Lord requires from us an openness to learning, self-denial and resistance to the worldly vices. As Christ says, *Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me*. But in order to come and learn what the Heavenly Father expects from us, we should show a willingness to listen to his Word.

The first reading in today's Liturgy of the Word tells the story of the prophet Elijah, who is going to the mountain of God, Horeb. From this Word we learn about the necessity of patience and perseverance, strengthened by God by consuming his special food, a very simple bread that came from heaven through the hands of an angel and gave Elijah the power to travel for 40 days without the need for any other food.

In the Letter to the Ephesians, on the other hand, we are instructed how to deal with others in order to truly reflect the fact that we are God's children, on whom the Holy Spirit placed his seal, so that our words and deeds may be pleasing to God: *be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ.*

Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus Christ himself teaches us which path to choose and follow, and what bread to eat in order to have the strength to reach the place where God dwells: *this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.* However, this place we're moving towards is no longer an imaginable mountain, but rather an unimaginable Kingdom of God.

While on earth there might be many ways to achieve a goal, many trails to reach the top of a mountain, in spiritual life there's only one path: holiness through Communion with God, achieved by partaking in the Eucharistic Bread, our proper food for the journey.
